CRUSADER ALUM LEADS OUR FLOCK

In 1979, teenagers were listening to *My Sharona* by The Knack and the Pittsburgh Steelers were winning the Super Bowl. The hit movies for the year were *Kramer vs. Kramer*, *Superman*, *The Muppet Movie*, *Rocky 2* and *The Amityville Horror*. The Sony Walkman was introduced that year. The President was Jimmy Carter; minimum wage was \$2.90 and a gallon of gasoline cost .86 cents. Fifty-two Americans were taken hostage in Iran and were to remain there for 444 days. The world was evolving and changing but at Notre Dame High School, one very well liked student was laying his foundation for future change.



Alfred A. Schlert was a senior at Notre Dame High School. He was President of Student Council and an honor student. He was a loyal Crusader, supporting his classmates in every aspect. During his years at ND, he was learning and growing in his faith, laying the foundation for his future. Then “Al Schlert” soon would become Father Alfred Schlert and later, Msgr. Alfred Schlert. During the summer of 2017, it was announced that our very own Crusader would become the fifth Bishop of his home Diocese when he was installed Most Rev. Alfred A. Schlert, Bishop of the Diocese of Allentown. Notre Dame could not be more proud of him and we are honored to have been part of his formidable years.

Bishop Schlert took time to answer our questions and give us insight into the direction he will lead our Diocese:

What does it mean to you to lead the Catholics in the Allentown Diocese after being born and raised in the same Diocese?



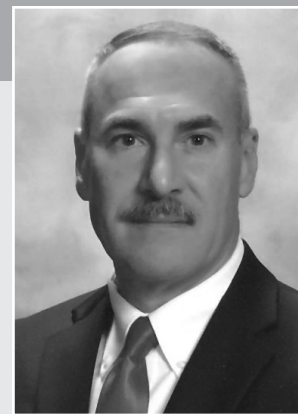

Looking for a Way to Help an ND Student?

Our senior students often look for a way to reinforce their Catholic faith and help strengthen what is taught in their classrooms. As part of their theological journey at Notre Dame, seniors are offered the opportunity to attend Kairos, a retreat specifically designed for our students. Participants attend this three night, four day retreat with other classmates and are encouraged to share their beliefs, experiences and questions in an open dialogue with prayer and our Catholic teachings as the foundation. Student leaders are trained to help direct the retreat with the help of moderators, the school chaplain and the campus ministry staff. The cost for the entire trip, which includes lodging,

meals, transportation and materials is approximately \$325 per student/attendee. Our school contributes \$125 toward each student's retreat, leaving the remainder as the family's responsibility.

Priesthood. I am honored to be able to be their Bishop and look forward to doing God's work with them.

What do you believe is the advantage you have in leading the same Diocese you "grew up in"?

I believe the advantage is in already knowing the great resources that the Diocese possesses in the dedicated Priests, Deacons, Consecrated Religious and Laity. We have been blessed abundantly by God in our Diocese, and together we can continue to build up our Roman Catholic Family of Faith.

What do you see as the biggest challenges you will have?

Our biggest challenge is a lack of priests. Everywhere I go, I encourage people to pray for vocations and I ask parents to be generous in supporting their sons if they express a desire to discern a call to the Priesthood.

What is your primary goal as our Bishop for the schools in our Diocese and the students?

Our schools must boldly and uncompromisingly maintain their Catholic identity in all ways – from academics to athletics, and everything in between. If we can do this, our schools will be strong and attractive to parents who wish an alternative to other educational choices.

How do you believe Notre Dame High School helped you in becoming a Bishop today?

Through the priests, Sisters, lay teachers, and fellow students at Notre Dame, I had an environment that helped and encouraged my vocation to the Priesthood. At Notre Dame, I made life-long friendships that support my vocation to this day.

In addition, I received a solid academic, social, and faith-based education that was the foundation of all the other life experiences I've had over the years.

Did you hear from many of your former classmates from Notre Dame and what message did they give you?

My classmates from the Class of 1979 were overwhelmingly supportive! Their cards, emails, and prayers were such a source of encouragement for me. Classmates came to the



ceremonies of Vespers and Ordination, one from as far away as Norway.

What is your fondest memory as a student at Notre Dame? As a teacher/chaplain?

I think the student part, I answered above.

My fondest memories at Notre Dame as a Chaplain/Teacher were the teachers I worked with everyday and the interaction with the students. It was a great experience that brought excitement and fulfillment each day. It's especially meaningful to reconnect now with former students, and to see how well they're raising their children and practicing their faith.

What teacher from Notre Dame played an important role in helping you today?

I had so many great teachers at Notre Dame, but some who were especially supportive of my priestly vocation were the Priests on the faculty, Deacon Anthony Koury, Sister Maria Benedetta, SSJ, Mrs. Rose Young, Mr. Frank Hogan, and Mr. Fagan.

If you could give one message to the students today about what an ND education has meant to you, what would it be?

I would encourage them to appreciate and absorb the great religious, academic, social, and athletic opportunities they are being given. These opportunities will enable them to live faith-filled, successful lives and vocations.

God Bless Bishop Schlert, Class of 1979, as he leads our faithful Diocese and schools in God's plan. We are blessed to call him a loyal Crusader!

Were you one of the lucky ones who had a bonfire while at ND? As a senior, did you get to help build the pile of wood? Well, in honor of our school's 60th Anniversary year, Mr. Lucrezi, our current ND Principal, brought back this wonderful tradition. The night before our rivalry game with Wilson HS, several



hundred ND students gathered to rekindle this tradition. There was a sea of almost 1000 people present, including students, faculty, families and a large group of alumni with their families. It was a great way to bridge the 60 years and see everyone celebrating the Crusader traditions.

Harvest & Hops Gala Auction

Two hundred of our most loyal Crusaders gathered to share memories, laughs and Crusader pride as we celebrated our 5th Gala Auction at Northampton Country Club. The auction had over 140 gifts used for both the Live and Silent auction events. Our first "Fund A Need" supported the Classroom Campaign and raised over \$7,000. Current ND families,



faculty and staff members volunteered their time with a smile to help raise funds for our school. Our emcee for the evening, Sam (Manento) Malone from Cat Country added a special touch to the evening as he is a Crusader from the Class of 1990. With the proceeds from this Gala Auction, we are hopeful to renovate three classrooms for our students.

Veteran's Day Celebration

Notre Dame saluted our alumni who have served our country and protected our freedoms with a Mass and reception this past November. Fifteen of our Veterans, from as far away as Oregon, representing the Vietnam and Korean Wars were present for Mass, celebrated by ND Chaplain Father Christopher Butera, who serves in the Army Reserves as a Chaplain. At the conclusion of Mass, Notre Dame presented our first "Salute to Veterans" award to Mr. Michael Mullins, Class of 1964, for his service during the Vietnam War. Also after Mass, the "Above the Best – Class of 1964 Patrick Mullins Memorial Scholarship Award" was presented to Christopher Bianchi. The Class of 1964 annually remembers Pat Mullins, who served in the US Air Force as a helicopter pilot during the Vietnam War. He is the lone Notre Dame alum to be killed in action during that war.



Notre Dame Alumni Athletes Honored

Notre Dame High School has a long tradition of not only producing some of the best students in the Lehigh Valley but also some of the most successful student-athletes. Over our 60 year history, we have followed the vision of Bishop Thompson and competed at a high level in most all sports offered by our public school counterparts. We have won championships in both the Centennial and Colonial Leagues, won District Titles, and many individual State Championships. Even before our teams entered post season competitions, our athletes were being recognized and recruited by some of the most prestigious and competitive college programs. Our coaches have done an amazing job of finding the athletes in our small student

enrollments, using the tools available to them and producing winners, both on and off the court.

Each year, we accept nominations from our Notre Dame alumni community and our supporters for our Athletic Hall of Fame. Every winter, we induct individuals and teams that have been selected by the committee based on their accomplishments. This past June, as many gathered to celebrate the All-Class Reunion on our Green Pond campus, tears were shed as we learned of the passing of one of our beloved alums, Sister Rosemarie Schwartz. Sister Rosie was a member of the Class of 1974 and a special person to many in the Notre Dame community. Rosie was part of the 1974 ND Crusaderettes that won

our school's first girls basketball District championship. She and her teammates are part of the 2018 Athletic Hall of Fame honorees. Rosie's favorite activity while in high school per the yearbook was basketball and her favorite memory was "being thrown out of the band room" (although she does not say why!). While at ND, she also participated in softball, band, color guard, guitarists, Spanish club and T.C.A. Everyone who came into Rosie's life became her friend.

Sister Rosie went on to help others through her ministry, working in various schools and parishes. She also worked five years at Gateway Rehabilitation Center as a counselor and therapist.

Music was always part of Sister Rosie's life. She infused music in all her activities and inspired many young children to take part in the arts. This passion came from her family, where she was one of eleven children. For her high school graduation, she received a six-string Martin guitar from her parents. It was this guitar that inspired what would be a life-long mission to fill the world she touched with music and joy. Often times, she would break out her guitar and join in family times of song and laughter.

Upon learning of Sister Rosie's passing, her former classmates have begun a memorial campaign in her honor. They have begun a fund to help purchase new pews for the Notre Dame Chapel in memory of Sister Rosie. Ave Maria Awards in April

Each year, with the help of our alumni and faithful supporters, we receive many nominations for our prestigious Ave Maria Awards. We are blessed to have numerous alumni who have achieved success in their professional lives, continue to live a life of faith and prayer and who make an impact within the communities they serve. The selection committee reviews the information on each nomination and has the difficult task of making the choice on who to honor each year. We are proud of every nomination and thankful to our committee for their hardwork once again. It is with great pleasure that we announce the 2018 Ave Maria Awards and our Bishop's Distinguished Catholic Graduate:

Distinguished Alumni Award: Mr. Edward Breiner, Class of 1973

After graduation, Ed went on to receive a degree from Bloomsburg University in Accounting. He later earned his MBA from the University of Dallas. He worked twenty-two years for Ingersoll Rand, leaving there as Vice President and Branch Manager of their Harrisburg PA site. He then joined Schramm Inc, which was a global design and manufacturer of mobile rotary drilling equipment used in gas and oil mining, construction and water infrastructure. In 2014, Ed was named the CEO of Schramm Inc. Under Ed's leadership, Schramm was one of the major companies who successfully saved the Chilean miners by building the drill rig bit that drove the equipment through the center of the earth to get to the miners and permit their rescue. Ed remains active on the Board of Schramm as well as on the board of Major Drilling International Inc., Chester County Economic Development, South Eastern Economic Development Company and World Trade Center of Greater Philadelphia. He served as President of the West Chester Food Cupboard and also the American Ground Water Trus. He is a member of the Chester County Food Bank Board.

Distinguished Religious Service Award: Mr. David Ifkovits, Class of 1979

David earned a degree in Music Education at Moravian College and studied Choral Conducting at Hartt School of Music. He is currently the Chairman of the Music Department at Archmere Academy as well as the Director of Music and Worship at Church of the Holy Child in Delaware. He has been Director of Music Ministry at St. Mary Magdalen Church in Wilmington

Delaware since 2016. Most recently, David was the liturgical music director for the installation of Bishop Alfred Schlert, Bishop of the Diocese of Allentown.

Distinguished Educator Award: Mr. Chuck Muller, Class of 1977

Fellow classmate, Tom Kresch, nominated Chuck as he learned of Chuck's retirement plans from Notre Dame High School. Chuck has been part of the Notre Dame High School community for more than a decade in various roles. He served as one of the school's first Directors of Development. He also served as Head Football Coach and most recently as Director of Discipline and Facilities Manager. In each of his roles, Chuck served the students and families of Notre Dame with pride and respect. In his positions, Chuck's leadership and good communication skills helped to develop a rapport with students, faculty, parents and donors that greatly benefitted Notre Dame High School and all he interacted with. Prior to coming to Notre Dame, "Coach" Muller spent many years in a successful career in Public Service and Corrections. He worked in one of the top level positions within the State of New Jersey Department of Corrections. Upon retiring from the State of New Jersey, Chuck saw the opportunity to come back to his alma mater and make an impact on the school he felt had given him so much.

Crusader Award: Jeff Dailey Memorial Foundation

Through the tragedy of the death of their son Jeffrey, Jane and Bobby Dailey wanted to continue the legacy Jeff had left at Notre Dame High School. Jeff was a tremendous student athlete while at Notre Dame who was taken from this life far too early. The Foundation was established to assist organizations such as Notre Dame in promoting the framework of Jeff's life: "My Brother's Keeper". The Foundation has assisted students and families at Notre Dame by awarding scholarships annually. In total, the Foundation has donated well in excess of \$50,000 in scholarship awards over the past 10 years. The Foundation also supports other endeavors at Notre Dame by their participation as the lead sponsor at the annual Gala Auction, where proceeds help to improve the campus facilities. They are a strong partner organization for our school.

Our bathrooms now are ADA compliant and meet today's

standards. Now it is time we look at our classrooms and bring them up to meet current needs.

With the help of alum Michael Tuskes, we are seeking out the best pricing to replace our classroom floors, paint each of the 25+ rooms, improve the lighting and window treatments as well as replace all the student desks and faculty furniture. This will cost approximately \$18,000 for each classroom. The Gala Auction for 2017 has raised enough to commit to three

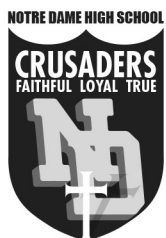
