


Earning Regents Diplomas and Regents Diplomas with Advanced Designation


Areas of Strength	Areas for Improvement
In 2012, approximately 88% of our student body has passed the English Regents at 65% or higher, and 47% achieved mastery at 85% or higher. This represents a significant increase compared to 2011 (86% passing and 34% mastery). In addition, 74% of last year's juniors met or exceeded the aspiration index of a score of 75 or higher, which puts students in a strong position to grapple with college-level reading and writing. 


- English Department produced a fully aligned, broad curriculum map with all core standards embedded into each course at every grade level.
- School-wide vocabulary initiative significantly upgraded in terms of rigor.
 40% of the level two words were replaced with level 3/common SAT words
- Intensive curriculum work on common core alignment, with an emphasis on non-fiction within English, Social Studies and Science courses
- Castle Learning software to be incorporated into instructional plan within all English Regents level and special education classes
- Emphasis on individual student ownership of skills strengths and weaknesses, develop metacognition
- Saturday intensive immersion sessions for Regents level Juniors in the spring. Last year, more than 75 juniors attended a mock-Regents on Saturday, May 12.
- Direct curriculum alignment with ESL 3 and grade level English class.
- Delayed focus on RCT option for special education students








- Heavy investment in 9th Grade Integrated Algebra courses
 - Additional teacher time allowed for significantly smaller class sizes
 - Additional teacher time provided for a Math Lab class to meet every other day for one semester (additional support and time for tiered learning)
 - Implementation of SpringBoard Pre AP Algebra Program (supplemental)
 - Two co-teach classes (Special Education Teacher is also Math Content Specialist)
- Use of Castle Learning software to enhance individualized support and provide targeted practice for students
- Use of iPads to enhance learning and increase student engagement
- Making content connections with science to reinforce applications and promote relevance, implementation of STEM model in geometry /chemistry
- Integration of sustainability and inquiry work to increase rigor in all math courses
- Integration of non-fiction reading and SAT-type questions, with an emphasis on vocabulary, word problems, and note taking in all math classes
- AIS classes still in place for students who need to retake Regents exams














SAT: All Students, How Does Sleepy Hollow Compare?




SAT, Sleepy Hollow HS 4 Year Performance Trends



SHHS AP: 13 Year Participation Trend




SHHS AP: 5 Year Trend
