



English Curriculum



Honors Survey of Literature

- Will cover literature at an accelerated pace and requires more extensive independent study with an emphasis on critical thinking and writing

CP Survey of Literature

- Provides an introduction to various genres of literature through relevant and representative readings. The basics of grammar, mechanics, and usage are covered to improve writing skills.

English 1

- This course is designed to instruct students in the basics used to understand the written/spoken language. Grammar and writing skills will be developed.



Foreign Language Curriculum

Spanish 1, French 1 and German 1

- Prerequisite: The student must have attained at least a seventh grade reading level and a knowledge of basic English grammar.


Spanish for Beginners

- This course is designed to create cultural awareness and develop fundamental language skills in Spanish.
- Students will be assigned to this course by the department chairperson and/or administration.

German for Beginners

- This course is designed to create cultural awareness and help the student develop basic language skills in German.
- Students will be assigned to this course by the department chairperson and/or administration.

Math Curriculum



Honors Algebra 1*

- In depth study of the topics included in Algebra 1 course.

Algebra 1*

- This course provides preparatory foundation in the fundamental concepts of algebra.

Basic Algebra 1, Part 1*

- This course, in conjunction with Basic Algebra 1, Part 2, will present the fundamental Algebra 1 topics taught over two years to allow the student to process the material at a pace conducive to their learning ability.

Honors Algebra 2 *

- This course includes major topics: the study of first and second degree equations and inequalities, functions, polynomials, rational and radical expressions and equations, and matrices. A TI-83/84 graphing calculator is required for this course.

Algebra 2 *

- This course covers traditional topics of a second year of algebra. A TI-83/84 graphing calculator is required for this course.

*** Prerequisite: Qualifying score based on the freshmen placement test.**



Science Curriculum

Basic Physical Science

- Introduction to the basic principles of chemistry and physics
- **Prerequisite: Students taking Basic Algebra 1, Part 1 concurrently**

CP Physical Science

- This course is designed to provide a strong general science background for students who may or may not enroll in any of the advanced science curriculum courses.
- **Prerequisite: Students taking Algebra 1 concurrently**

Honors Physical Science

- This course is designed to provide a strong basic science background for students who will enroll in any of the honors science courses throughout their high school career. This course will be faster paced than CP Physical Science and students will carry out independent work as required.
- **Prerequisite: Students taking Honors Algebra 2 or Algebra 2 as a freshmen.**



Social Studies Curriculum

CP American Cultures (1877-Present)

- This course of historical study of American history begins with the end of the Reconstruction Era and continuing to the present time.

Honors American Culture

- This course will demand independent reading of both the textbook and of supplemental material. Topics covered will be essentially the same as the regular course, with a deeper investigation and at a faster pace.
- **Prerequisite: 90 overall average in grade 8; recommendation of Dept. Chair.**



Theology Curriculum

Revelation of Jesus Christ in Scripture (first semester)

- The purpose of this college prep course is to give students a general knowledge and appreciation of the Sacred Scriptures.

Who is Jesus Christ (second semester)

- The purpose of this course is to introduce students to the mystery of Jesus Christ, the living Word of God, the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity.

Introduction to Catholic Thought

- This course is designed for students transitioning to ND who have a limited knowledge base in Roman Catholic doctrine. The course is not a remedial presentation , but rather a foundation for future religious study. **Enrollment will be limited to students entering ND for the first time.**



HONORS


Honors will be awarded at the end of each quarter, the end of each semester, and the end of the year. Honors will be awarded to the students who meet the following criteria:

Distinguished Honors – a grade of 93 or above in all subjects

First Honors – a grade of 93 or above in all major subjects, with a grade above 85 in a minor

Second Honors – a grade of 85 or above in all subjects




