Effective Consequences for Reducing Misbehavior

Consequences works best if they have these characteristics.

Remember to TEACH your child!

T (time)

- Immediate: discipline right after the misbehavior
- Short: no discipline should last longer than an hour for young children!

E (execute)

Follow-through: stick to the discipline once you give it

A (appropriate)

- <u>Let the punishment fit the crime</u>: use a consequence that matches the severity of the misbehavior. In other words, don't overreact!
- <u>Individualize punishment to the child</u>: get to know what works best with your particular child—what they respond to and what they don't respond to

C (calm)

- Matter-of-fact: discipline without yelling or criticizing
- Be a good model: show your child how you want him/her to behave

H (help)

- Help your child move on to more positive behaviors
- Help your child realize that it is the behavior, not him/her, that you disapprove of
