### Comprehensive Needs Assessment Summary

The Needs Assessment conducted for R.T. Barrera Elementary was formal. A staff questionnaire was conducted in February 2016.

The data from the spring administration of the State of Texas Assessment of Academic Readiness (STAAR), Texas English Language Proficiency Assessment System (TELPAS), Texas Primary Reading Inventory (TPRI), and district benchmarks were disaggregated by grade level, demographic subgroups, subjects, and objectives. The student and staff attendance rates and the failure/retention list were also reviewed.

# Comprehensive Needs Assessment Based on Observation Demographics

This area was one of two areas that the staff gave the highest overall rating. Research shows that understanding and applying the demographic make- up of a school can be instrumental in the development of its success.

**Strengths:** The use of the DMAC system is very user friendly. It allows the teachers easy access to locate and analyze student's demographic data. Teachers are able to access state and local test results to identify students in need of extra intervention to ensure that they are successful.

**Weaknesses:** Based on observations, our attendance information needs to be monitored more closely. Teachers and parents are aware of the importance of having students in school every single day, but we as administrators have to make greater efforts to support and enhance our strategies to ensure that our attendance rate improves. We need to be more proactive in informing our parents of the importance of having their children attend school every single day.

## Comprehensive Needs Assessment Based On Observation Student Achievement

The most important part of the school is students; they are our reason for being. Our responsibility is to provide an effective curriculum that will equip these students with the skills and expertise to be successful after graduation, whether they enter the military, the job force, or continue their education through a technical school, college, or university. The environment in which these students are taught must be conducive to learning. For this reason we must constantly be refining our tools, refining our strengths, and improving our weaknesses. The following students' strengths and needs were identified.

**Strengths:** The implementation of the computer program SuccessMaker continues to help our students strengthen their skills in Reading and Math. Teachers were allotted 30 minutes every day for  $1^{st}$ , 2nd,  $3^{rd}$ ,  $4^{th}$ , &  $5^{th}$  grade students. We had our Reading resource teacher provide intervention & enrichment strategies to students struggling with Reading and to students that needed to be challenged in Reading to our  $3^{rd}$ ,  $4^{th}$  &  $5^{th}$  grade students. We had the dyslexia teacher provide extra help to our 504 students in  $1^{st}$ ,  $2^{nd}$ ,  $3^{rd}$ ,  $4^{th}$ ,  $5^{th}$  grade. We had our coach provide extra help in the area of comprehension during his conference period. We had all of our paraprofessionals helping with intensive instructional strategies that enhanced the learning of our students in the areas of Reading, Math, Writing, & Science in all grade levels. The entire school staff provided motivation to all of our students and helped them believe in themselves.

**Weaknesses:** Based on observations, data provided by the TAPR report and the STAAR for the previous year, the following areas were targeted for improvement: Science & Writing. These areas will be emphasized for the upcoming school year. Science & Writing need to be addressed and monitored more effectively starting in Pre-Kinder through 5<sup>th</sup> grade. Summer planning for vertical and horizontal planning for a Science and Writing curriculum where student objectives will be broken down and effective hands-on activities will be implemented to bring more student knowledge and awareness to the importance both bring to their success.

## Comprehensive Needs Assessment Based On Observation School Culture and Climate

We know that culture and learning are connected in important ways. The culture and the climate of a school sets the foundation for what's to become the second home to many of our students and our staff. We have been very fortunate to have the support of all of our teachers, parents, administrators, and our community members. R.T. Barrera Elementary continues to be a learning community where everyone is nurtured, respected and challenged.

**Strengths:** Our teachers are passionate, enthusiastic, and most importantly, everyone is clear with our purpose, "It's about Student Learning" and "Setting High Expectations." Parents are invited to participate in show-and-tells, storytelling, food tasting, and many more activities that help them become better prepared to help their children be successful life-long learners. Our Eagles' Garden has provided our students with a different learning experience that has truly given them the self-esteem and generated greater respect for their own learning. All of our stakeholders have in one way or another provided us with the support needed to continue achieving great success.

**Weaknesses:** We need to continue providing a safe & nurturing learning environment for all of our students and staff. Teachers will continue to motivate our students by implementing strategies that will enrich & enhance their knowledge.

# Comprehensive Needs Assessment Based On Observation Staff Qualifications/Professional Development

A highly qualified and highly trained staff is perhaps the most important ingredient in the teaching-learning equation. State law has long required teachers to be degreed and certified in the areas to which they are assigned. While appropriate certification is important, experience and relevant professional development are also essential and must be considered when evaluating staff. Based on observation, the following staff strengths and needs were identified:

**Strengths:** Most of the staff members at R.T. Barrera Elementary have worked in this educational setting for several years. All staff members have been trained through staff development in strategies dealing with all student populations. Staff is provided opportunities to participate in timely and appropriate professional development throughout the school year. The staff understands that the most important factor in the education of every student is the teacher that sets high expectations for both herself/himself and their students. All of our staff members have a strong sense of pride about our campus.

**Weaknesses:** Our own statistics show that a large percentage of teachers have less than 8 years teaching experience. Our staff is comprised of a fairly young group of teachers that need more experience in how lessons can be differentiated and where integration of different subject matter can be more effective. We need to provide more research-based professional development on effective teaching strategies that can help our students understand the concepts better.

## Comprehensive Needs Assessment Based on Observation Curriculum and Instruction

We had an increase of 10 to 15% in all subject areas. We implemented multiple instructional strategies conducted by teachers and paraprofessionals in all grades and subjects.

**Strengths:** All the staff is dedicated to the success of every student. All subject areas were emphasized in the curriculum. Accelerated Reader was implemented and many activities were planned school-wide to promote Reading, Math, Writing, & Science. The staff had numerous professional development sessions on campus and off campus to ensure that instruction and assessments were aligned. Administrators were highly visible in the classrooms and throughout the school. Professional learning communities met weekly and were focused on student improvement. The PLC's were more interactive and the team members were more focused on the 3 big ideas: 1. Data 2. Cooperation 3. Results oriented. Integration of subjects was implemented and students were very receptive to different activities practiced.

**Weaknesses:** The interventions in Science did not address all the students' needs. Earlier more effective interventions are warranted in Reading, Math, Writing, & Science. Deep alignment is needed in the planning and delivery of instruction (content, context and cognitive levels). There is a need to continue training and implementation on differentiated of instruction. Continue effective and constructive monitoring focusing in on Reading, Math, Writing, & Science. There is a need to enhance the training of teachers and administrators on highly effective research based strategies.

### Comprehensive Needs Assessment Based On Observation

### Family and Community Involvement

Family is often the cornerstone of any social structure. Families have a strong sense of interdependence, mutual respect, and co-parenting. Grandparents, godparents, aunts, uncles, and older siblings may be helping to raise our students. This extended family might live at home, visit frequently, or live nearby. Understanding this family structure might help us gain trust and participation from both the immediate and extended family members.

**Strengths:** Teachers have built a strong relationship with the parents. Parents are provided opportunities to participate in activities that have an important impact on the success of every student in our campus. Teachers have ongoing one-to-one conferences with parents to discuss the student's strengths and weaknesses. Parents are invited and encouraged to take part in many of the activities that we have throughout the year. (e.g. development of our Eagle's Garden, library, safety, counseling, health, etc.)

**Weaknesses:** We need to survey our parents to gather information that will give us a better perspective on their interests. We need to bring presenters that will incorporate strategies that will motivate our parents to continue helping their children succeed in and out of school.

### Comprehensive Needs Assessment Based On Observation

### School Context and Organization

The final ingredient in a successful teaching-learning process that we will consider is the facilities in which the process is carried out. Facilities include more than the building, i.e., equipment, supplies, and materials needed to enhance the instruction provided by the teachers.

**Strengths:** Our facility is still fairly new. The custodial staff has been working very hard to maintain the campus in utmost condition. We have 6 computers for each Kinder, 4 computers for each 1<sup>st</sup> grade classroom. All classrooms have an LCD Projector, a Document Camera which facilitate the implementation of technology in their classrooms. Every classroom has been provided with a smartboard and a laptop. Wired fence built that provides not only beautification for the school but most importantly it provides the needed safety and security to all of our students and staff. We are currently in our 4<sup>th</sup> year of a 5 year plan of development of our Eagles' garden through a 1 million Texas Transformation grant. This grant is a 5 year project of Texas Agri Life Extension Center to improve the health and quality of life for our students. The Goal is for our students to get hands on learning, to build science, math, teamwork skills, growing and eating vegetables while enhancing citizenship skills where everybody takes responsibility for the garden success.

**Weaknesses:** Problems with the temperature of sections of the building distract from the teaching-learning process. Many of the ceiling areas have water leaks during the rainy season. Our gym does not have air conditioning and it must remain completely open during the school day. This invites unwelcome guests, (i.e., bees, rattle snakes). We need more computers in 3-5 classrooms and more help with the upkeep of our technology equipment.

# Comprehensive Needs Assessment Based On Observation Technology

Technology plays a very important part in the success of a school. Today students are proactive and more keen to the use of technology. Our staff understands that by incorporating and implementing technology into their daily lessons their students become more proficient in this area.

**Strengths:** All of our teachers are proficient in the use of technology in the classroom. Staff development has provided them with excellent sessions on the different technology integrations they can use in their classrooms. Our students are active participants in their education. The use of hands-on technology activities has promoted and enhanced our students' potential to learn and succeed in today's ever evolving technology world.

**Weaknesses:** We need to upgrade our technology equipment to ensure that our teachers have the necessary tools to deliver their instruction effectively.

### Correlates of Effective Schools

#### 1. Safe and Orderly Environment

In the effective school, there is an orderly, purposeful, businesslike atmosphere, which is free from threat of physical harm. The school climate is not oppressive and is conducive to teaching and learning.

#### 2. Climate of High Expectations For Success

In the effective school, there is a climate of expectation in which the staff believes and demonstrates that all students can attain mastery of the essential school skills and that they, the staff, have the capability to help all students do so.

#### 3. Instructional Leadership

In the effective school, the principal acts as instructional leader and effectively and persistently communicates that mission to the staff, parents, and students.

#### 4. Clear and Focused Mission

In the effective school, there is a clearly articulated school mission through which the staff shares an understanding of a commitment to the instructional goals.

#### 5. Opportunity to Learn and Student Time on Task

In the effective school, teachers allocate a significant amount of classroom time to instruction in the essential skills. For a high percentage of this time students are engaged in whole class or small group learning activities that are planned both teacher directed and student directed.

In the effective school, student academic progress is measured frequently. A variety of assessment procedures are used. The results of the assessments are used to improve individual student performance and also to improve the instructional program.

The staff will be trained in Highly Effective Questioning Techniques utilizing Bloom's Taxonomy and Erickson's Structure of Knowledge and they will be well versed in the development of Assessments.

<u>Student Performance Data:</u> By 2017, all students will meet or exceed the academic standards for Recognized District set forth by the state's Academic Excellence Indicator System.

<u>Student Populations</u>: By 2017, the District will continue to recognize all special populations, enhance the existing programs which provide services to these children, and develop additional ones to meet the new and emerging trends, as well as to assure equity and quality of services for all its students.

<u>Support Structure:</u> By 2017, the District will assure that its support structure has contributed to the development and maintenance of an educational program that will provide safe and appropriate settings for students and staff, state-of-the-art equipment and technology, sufficient supplies and materials, highly qualified staff, continuous professional development training, parental involvement, and ensure the process for participation in decision-making by all of its members.

<u>Technology</u>: By 2017, integration of technology into the instructional program will be established through the continued support of local area networks, wide area networks, and internet connectivity for all campuses, all aimed at improving the quality of staff development practices, expanding the boundaries of teaching and learning capabilities for teachers and students, exposing our students of the most current information and practices available, establishing a coherent sequence of course contents aligned to the Technology Application TEKS across all grade levels, and assuring that the quality education offered to our students is competitive and superior to others.

SCHOOL-WIDE PROGRAM PLAN

R. T. Barrera Elementary School uses its Title I, Part A and other federal funds to upgrade the entire instructional program by implementing a school-wide program as authorized under the provisions of Public Law 107-110. We conducted a comprehensive needs assessment and observations over a period of one year to determine the strengths and needs of students, staff, parental involvement, community involvement, and facilities before deciding how to use the local, state, and federal resources available. Based on that assessment, it was decided to concentrate on improving the passing rate of all students and all student groups on the STAAR. The long-range goal is to have at least 90 percent of all students and all student groups passing all parts of the STAAR test by spring of 2017 administration. With Level III advanced performance of 25% or higher in both Reading, Math, Writing, & Science.

Highly qualified teachers will carry out the instructional program. Only teachers who are certified by the State to teach the subjects/grade levels to which they are assigned will be recommended by the school. The school will consider teachers who have alternative certification. The school will provide access to high-quality ongoing professional development throughout the school year for all staff including teachers, principals, and paraprofessionals. Professional development activities will be geared to individual teachers' specialties and needs as determined by the staff. Professional development will be conducted both at the school and the education service center as well as applicable conferences and workshops and will be intensive and sustained.

Teachers will be helping in making decisions regarding the use of academic assessments to measure student performance. Teachers will use data obtained from the STAAR, as well as other instruments, including but not limited to, the TPRI and readiness tests to implement new instructional strategies, modify existing strategies, and/or discontinue existing strategies to better address student needs as determined by use of these instruments.

Students experiencing difficulty in mastering the STAAR will be provided effective, timely additional assistance. All teachers will closely monitor all students' performance based on daily exercises and periodic tests. Students not mastering the objectives will be provided additional assistance in the tutorial program, or the remedial reading program based on his/her individual needs.

SCHOOL-WIDE PROGRAM PLAN

Assignment to alternative instructional strategies will be timely based on the teacher's evaluation of objective data and professional judgment. The school will coordinate and integrate federal, state, and local programs and services to maximize the effectiveness of these resources.

Other federal programs used to fund the school wide program include Title I, Part C Migrant Education Program to identify and recruit children of migratory workers for supplemental services designed to reduce the educational disruptions and other problems that result from repeated moves, Title III to provide supplemental services to help ensure that children who are limited English proficient attain English language proficiency and develop high levels of academic attainment. Other state programs, in addition to those described above, include Bilingual Education used to obtain special materials to enhance the bilingual program and Title II Part D, Enhancing education through Technology.
