



Nurse Updates

- All students must be immunization compliant by the first day of school. (9/6/22)
 - If in doubt, check with the health office.
- Please keep the nurses informed of any recent health updates on your child.
- Emergency contacts must be local, available, and aware that you may need them.
- All students who require emergency medication such as an inhaler or Epipen, must have doctor's order forms updated annually. Students may not go on any field trips until this requirement is met.
 - Students may carry these medications if the doctor and parent indicate on the updated form that they are "self-directed".
- The nurses always welcome a back-up supply of medication in the health office, even when a student is deemed "self-directed".

After School Procedures

- Students are not permitted in any unsupervised locations at any time.
- All after school/bus notes must be turned in at arrival to the bin at the front entrance. We prefer you to fill out this online form: https://forms.office.com/r/Hqjr2CTnzB
- 4:15 and 5:30 p.m. activity buses will be available for students to take home. (Please note: The 4:15 p.m. and 5:30 p.m. activity buses have different routes and the stop is likely to be farther away from your home).
- Parents who would like their child to walk home every day must send a note to the school's assistant principal at the beginning of the year stating their permission to walk.

Attendance

- When students are absent from school, parents must report the absence by phone on each morning of the absence
- JJMSAttendance@klschools.org or 914 763 7501 and press # 2
- Excused absences from school are: illness of the student; death in the family; religious observance; required attendance in court; approved school-sponsored activities, emergency medical or dental appointments.
- Excused absences require a written note from a parent/guardian to become excused.
- Students who arrive to class after 8:10 a.m. are considered tardy.
- Three unexcused late arrivals to school in a month will result in a conversation with a counselor or administrator.

Dress Code

All students are expected to give proper attention to personal cleanliness and to dress appropriately for school and school functions. At *no time* may student's clothing include items that are vulgar, obscene, libelous, denigrate others on account of race, color, weight, national origin, ethnic group, religion, religious practice, disability, sexual orientation, gender or sex.

A student's dress shall:

- Not include items that are vulgar, obscene, and libelous or denigrate others on account of race, color, weight, national origin, ethnic group, religion, religious practice, disability, sexual orientation, gender or sex.
- Cover undergarments (waistbands and bra straps are allowed to show).
- Cover all private parts and the fabric covering private parts must not be see through.
- Ensure that hats or other headgear are not worn in hallways, dining room/cafeteria, classrooms, or any instructional areas. Exceptions will be made for medical or religious requirements.

Please refer to the Handbook for the complete dress code.

Academic Honesty

Students may not represent the work of others as their own.

This includes:

Cheating on homework, tests, and when using technology

Committing forgery

Plagiarism

Behavior

All students must always keep their hands, feet, objects and negative comments to themselves.

- The same in-school behavior is expected on all school transportation and outside school functions.
- When playing sports during recess, follow the rules of the game and listen to adults!
- Overly physical play is not permitted (running into each other, pushing, throwing things at each other).
- Use positive language- cursing, calling someone a derogatory name, etc. is unacceptable.

Cell Phones

- Cell phones must be turned off and stored in a safe place throughout the day.
 - First Violation: Student can get their phone backparents are contacted
 - Second Violation: Parent must come to get the phone during regular school hours.
- Students may not use their cell phones to contact parents before going to the nurse (if feeling ill).
- There is a phone in the dining room for students who need to contact their parent during lunch.

Homework

- Students are expected to request and complete work sent home by teachers during any excused absence.
- Always check the Schoology page and have a partner in each class.
- In the case of an unexcused absence, teachers are not required to give information to students <u>in</u> <u>advance</u> of their absence.
