CMP's Student Health and Safety Policy

Many children have already been sick this year. Below are a few reminders of CMP's policy to keep everyone as healthy and safe as possible.

The following is a summary of health guidelines that the school is required to abide by:

- 1. It is the policy of The California Montessori Project to allow students to attend school when they have minor allergies.
- 2. Any contagious illnesses and/or a fever of 100° F or higher require the student to be absent from school. The child must remain fever-free for twenty-four hours prior to returning to school. Contagious illnesses require that the student has been on an approved course of medication for at least twenty-four hours prior to returning to school along with a doctor's note indicating that the student is no longer contagious and is ready to return to school. Please be conscious of these policies and take the other children and staff into consideration in this regard.

Medication:

- When any prescribed medication needs to be given to a child, the school must have written permission and instructions from the parent and the child's doctor before school staff can administer the medication. A Medical Alert form and a Permission to Administer Medication form may be obtained from the school office.
- Over-the-Counter medication may not be administered by school staff unless a written note from the child's doctor gives specific dosages and directions. For safety reasons, children may NOT carry over-the-counter medications with them, such as throat lozenges, cough drops, cortisone cream, and the like.

Parent Participation Hours and the Harvest Festival

Parents can earn parent participation credit for purchasing items for classrooms or the school, as long as they are not asking to be reimbursed. When it comes to purchasing tickets to use at an event, they cannot receive parent participation credit because they are getting something in return, which is why they cannot be reimbursed and get hours. When you volunteer to work at an event, you will receive credit for the time you worked. If you cook/ bake something to donate for an event, you may get credit for the items purchased and the time it took to cook.
