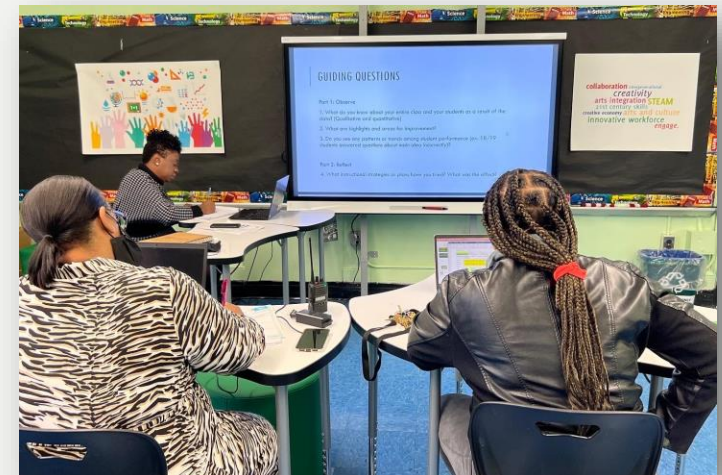

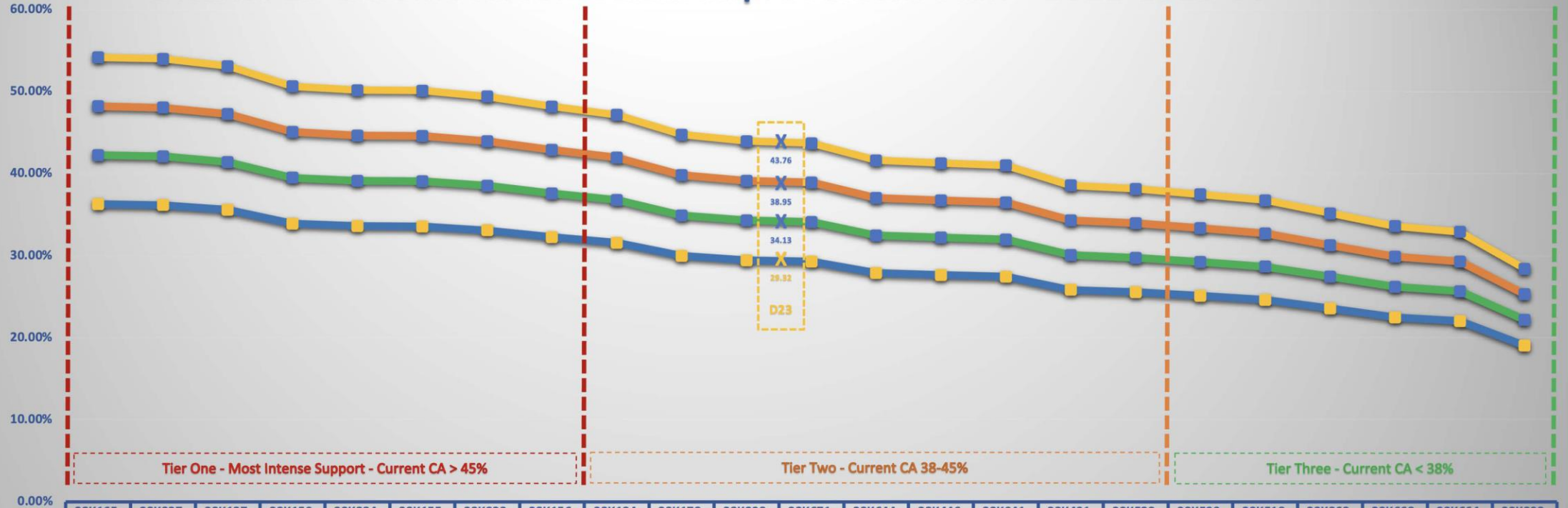

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What are Community Services Block Grants (CSBG)?
CSBGs grant support programs and services that help low-income families and individuals attain skills, knowledge, motivation, and opportunities to become self-sufficient.

The CSBG program began as the Economic Opportunity Act of 1964—part of President Lyndon B. Johnson's "War on Poverty"—and was replaced by the Community Service Act of 1975. President Ronald Reagan replaced it in 1981 with CSBGs, which required funds to be administered by the states. Since 1984, the law has required **Maximum Feasible Participation of residents in the decision-making process of which programs and services are needed and funded in their communities.**

How much does New York City receive?
The City of New York receives \$12.6 million in CSBG funding, annually. It allocates:

- \$15.6 million to the Neighborhood Development Areas Initiative (NDAs) for programs including Economic Development, Safety & Crime, Literacy, Language Services, Educational Support, Healthy Families, and Senior Services.
- \$17 million is allocated to specific initiatives such as: **Fatherhood Comprehensive Services for Immigrant Families, English as a Second Language, Adolescent Literacy, the Summer Youth Employment Program (SYEP) and classes to obtain the Family Development Certificate.**

Who does the CSBG program serve?
It targets people living below 120 percent of the federal poverty level. Each initiative CSBG funds for a wide range of programs and services in these low-income communities. CSBG programs target the neighborhoods with the highest percentages of families with low household income. DYCD uses data from the NYC Department of City Planning to make the boundaries for each NDA. The goal for these programs is to serve at least 80 percent of those living within a 10-mile boundary of the NDA.

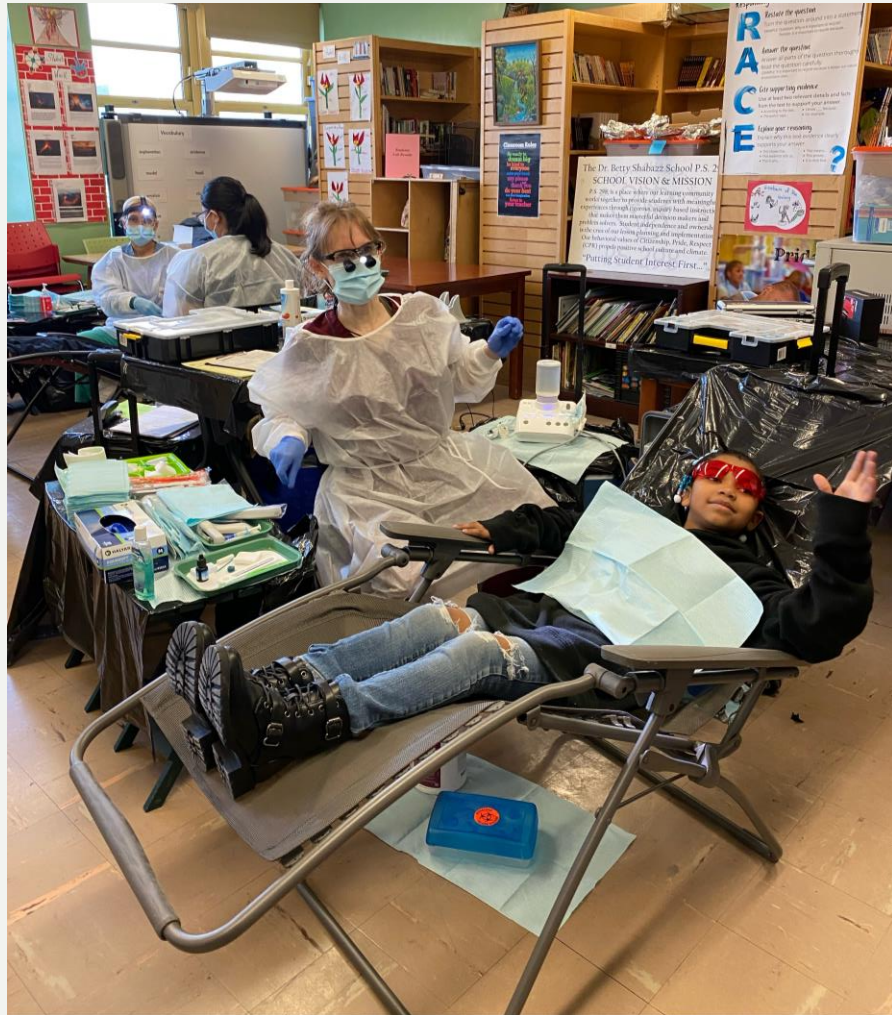
