GOLD/BLUE ACTIVITIES 2016-2017

Students choose a "blue" activity which will meet October 6th, November 3rd, February 9th, and March 9th. Students ALSO choose a "gold" activity which will meet October 25th, November 22nd, February 21st, and March 21st.

- 1. READ the following club descriptions. Be careful, some are restricted.....
- 2. From the "blue" column, number your choices (1....2.....3) to reflect your top 3 blue choices you would like to be a part of.
- 3. From the "gold" column, number your choices (1...2...3) to reflect your top 3 gold clubs you would like to be in.
- 4. DO NOT hand it in with check marks, "x's", or just a 1 with no 2 and 3. EVERYONE MUST SELECT SOMETHING!!!!
- 5. Hand it in to your homeroom teacher. First come, first served! The earlier you submit your form, the better your chances of getting your number 1 choices.
- 6. Diversify....don't pick the same club twice (unless it is mandatory, such as Pysanky.)
- 7. REMEMBER:::: If you are already a member of Student Council, you MUST choose only that activity for Blue. As is the same for National Honor Society, you MUST choose only that activity for Gold.

ACTIVITY-CLUB DESCRIPTIONS

Separated by Color

BLUE

Student Council - This group is comprised of students (elected by their peers during homeroom voting) to represent the student body and **MUST** choose this as their blue activity. Place a "1"only, in the blue activity column since you need no other choices. Members will be required to be available for various in school and after school activities. They must also represent Marian High School within the surrounding communities. **Mrs. Coles**

Arts & Crafts - Different crafts will be introduced involving painting, foam, etc. Projects are NOT complicated. (A \$10 fee must be paid when signing up. Those unpaid will be switched to their 2nd choice: limited to 25 students) *Ms. Belfiore*

Board Games - Come join the fun. Relax and challenge your mind as you sit and play an old favorite game with a friend. Life, Connect 4, and Mouse Trap are some of the favorites! *Mrs. Patton*

Boys' Recreational Basketball - This is a basketball shooting activity. Various basketball shooting games will be played. (**Limited to 20 boys**) *Mr. Brutto*

<u>Chess</u> - You will learn the fundamentals of chess, including some basic strategies and moves. There will be a tournament in which all members of the club will participate. (**Limited to 20 students**) *Ms. Velekei*

<u>Dance Team</u> – A combination of jazz, lyrical and hip-hop put together to choreographed music. (Limited to 20 students) *Moderator - Mrs. Heffelfinger Instructor - Kira Adams*

<u>Drama</u> - The club will try to enhance the students' appreciation for the performing arts. Emphasis will be placed on helping with the school's drama productions. All members will do an all-school play in conjunction with the Christmas Concert and assist with the Senior Play. (Limited to 25 students) *Ms. Martini*

<u>Emergency Preparedness</u> - Students will learn how to manage simple but critical emergencies they may encounter throughout life. Examples include how to extinguish a small house fire, steps taken to reduce panic in emergency situations, and simple first aid responses. (Limited to 15 students) *Mrs. Hydock*

<u>Gardening Club</u>-T his group will work on the horticulture of Marian's campus. You will need to bring your own gardening gloves for weeding and planting. Other tools will be provided. *Mrs. Costello*

<u>Jigsaw Puzzles</u> - For those students looking for a visual challenge, this fun activity provides just that opportunity. Puzzles of various sizes, shapes, and content will be used. *Mr. DeAngelo*

<u>Lego Builders</u> - Legos are a fun and creative way to stimulate spacial intelligence and foster problem solving and creativity. Students may work individually or in small groups to design and build whatever they like. There is a small fee of \$10 for this club- which will be used to purchase more Legos. In lieu of money, a donation of Legos is greatly appreciated. *Ms. Rohart*

<u>Loom Knitting</u> - This club provides a way to make something useful and beautiful. The loom is easy to use and nearly impossible to mess up. The technique is quickly learned and easily applied to knit various items. Students will make a scarf to be donated to the Marian Basket Auction. A scarf can be made in several hours. <u>Martial Arts</u> - The Martial Arts and Self-Defense Club will allow students the opportunity to acquire skills and techniques to defend themselves should the occasion arise. <u>Media</u> – (FRESHMEN AND SOPHOMORE BOYS ONLY) This group is designed for students seeking basic learning skills of audio-visual aids which include the proper use of the video camera. <u>Movie Club</u> – Movies shown will be based on real life stories that have taken place. Examples are "Lean on Me", "Erin Brockovich", "We are Marshall." (**Limited to 30 students**) *Ms. Bechtel*

The year will culminate in a partner's tournament for all members. (**Limited to 12 students**) *Mr. Forgotch*

<u>PJAS</u> (PA Junior Academy of Science) - (Make sure you pick this for blue as well – you must do this activity for both!) Students choose and research a science project which they will present at the PJAS conference in Easton. Winners will have the opportunity to compete in the PA State Competition at PSU in May. *Mr. Valente*

<u>Pysanky</u> - (Make sure you pick this for blue as well – you must do this activity for both!)

Students will practice the art of creating Easter Eggs with geometric designs by using a stylus pen, beeswax, and various dyes. A \$6.00 fee will be charged in order to provide the dyes, stylus and eggs. This fee should be submitted to Mrs. Nietz, Ms. Belfiore or handed in on the first day. You will need a shirt in order not to stain your uniform.
