The school community has been busy bonding and connecting after our recent Parent Social and the K/1 Annual Art Show and Spaghetti Dinner. With their students' artwork, the K/1 team raised over \$600 to continue to support the education of the 8 girls from The Gambia, West Africa who would otherwise not be able to afford to attend school. They are over half way to their total goal of \$1,200.

They are immersing themselves in an organic farming experience at Elkus Ranch near Half Moon Bay and will then participate in a team building Ropes Course experience at Mt. Hermon. They are also participating in a beach cleanup effort and survey sponsored by the California Department of Fish and Game.
