The Comfort Dog program in P.S. 90

There are many ways to read in their 5th grade 12:1 class. One is to place one hand on the laptop and the other on Jed who listens intently to your fluency and intonation. Jed, PS 90's Comfort Dog, has his own Twitter feed. Follow him at @PS90JED.



The Comfort Dog program's innovative approach to socialemotional learning provides students with life skills critical to their success in the classroom and beyond. Social-emotional supports can be integrated into classroom teaching and guidance counseling to help students develop effective communication and teamwork, conflict-resolution and problem-solving tactics, and relationship building. In the summer of 2010 a quarter-acre of asphalt parking lot behind PS 216, was dug up to start building an Edible School Yard. Teachers use the garden which has a chicken coop, a composting system and a rain water collection system to teach lessons in art, math and science. The new building also has communal tables where children share meals from the food they grow together. District 21's Principals joined PS 216 in their garden on September 26, 2017 for a day of professional learning.

We are pleased to announce that District 21 received a grant from the U.S. Department of Education's Arts in Education Program in the amount of \$1,098,886. This funding will allow schools to develop programs to address the language needs of our English learners through the arts. Each program will be customized to the needs of each school. The schools involved are P.S./I.S. 95, 225, 226, I'S. 96, 228, 281 and 303. The name of the program is "Digital DELLTA" and will be supported by Arts-Connection – Linking Learning to the Arts. The first day of professional development is scheduled for November 7, 2017, and will be held at I.S. 228. We want to thank Carol Morgan, Deputy Director for Education for Arts Connection and all of our Principals for their work in securing this grant. A special thank you to our Superintendent Isabel DiMola for pursuing this opportunity and supporting our schools for the benefit of our English Language Learners and to Neal Opromalla, Principal Leadership Director for taking the lead on this project and managing the grant to ensure every cent is spent to expand opportunities for our students.

Dad's Take Your Child to School Day is an annual event that promotes father involvement by encouraging fathers and significant male caregivers to take their child to school. P.S. 100 and P.S 216 had over 300 male role models take their children to school this year.

Middle School News

Each fall, every fifth grade student attending a New York City public elementary school receives a middle school application. Students must apply to middle school, including those who want to stay at their K-8 school.

Students with disabilities may apply through the Middle School Admissions along with their general education peers. <u>Special Education students</u> with an Individual Education Program (IEP) that recommends a specialized District 75 program are not required to participate in the Middle School Admissions if they wish to remain in a District 75 program.

Kindergarten News

In New York City, children are eligible to apply to kindergarten in the year they turn five. Each winter, kindergarten applications are accepted for the coming school year and every child is guaranteed a kindergarten placement.

All schools are expected to serve the majority of special education students in their community, and all schools are required to provide, at minimum, English as a New Language (ENL) programs to their English Language Learners.

Gifted & Talented

All students who will be entering kindergarten through third grade for the 2018-2019 school year can sign up to test for G&T programs. Get ready by taking these next steps:

- Read the 2018 Gifted & Talented Handbook: Learn about G&T Admissions, find programs that interest you, and prepare for the G&T test with practice problems.
- missions Event in October: Come to an event in your district to learn about G&T and 0.017Elementary Admissions.
- Sign up to take the G&T test by Monday, November

Families who have a student entering kindergarten for the 2018-2019 school year should also know about Kindergarten Admissions and those school options.
