## Guidelines and Responsibilities of Student Council

Parents and Students, please initial that you have read each item listed below.
$\qquad$ 1. Each student council officer will abide by and enforce CUSD procedures and responsibilities.
$\qquad$ 2. To be eligible for office you may have had NO suspensions this school year, and you will immediately loose your official position if you are suspended once being elected.
$\qquad$ 3. Officers will be held accountable for following all school rules. You will sign a contract and be expected to uphold all agreements, or you may lose your position.
$\qquad$ 4. All student council representatives must maintain a 2.0 Grade Point Average, with no marks below an " S ", as well as be a model student, completing all assignments.
$\qquad$ 5. If elected you will sign an application, you are accepting the responsibility of the time and effort that is needed for this position, and will attend ALL meetings.
$\qquad$ 6. All officers must be dependable, honest, responsible, and kind.
$\qquad$ 7. All officers must be on time to school and have a minimum amount of absenses.

## Campaigning:

Posters: Each candidate may display one poster in their classroom, one in the cafeteria (must furnish his or her own tape, paper, paint, etc.) Maximum size of any poster is $4 \times 3$ feet, and one post on our website. Candidates will refrain from climbing on anything in order to hang posters.

Give-aways: Candidates are not to use any "give-aways" during the duration of the elections (tags, candy, money, etc.). The character of a candidate is not defined by what they can give away to others and we want to keep the election fair.

Campaign Assembly: Each candidate will be limited to a two minute speech. All speeches will be reviewed. Please do not make promises you can not keep.
You may have ONE "Campaigne Manager." He or she may wear spirit wear in support of you, or help you with a prop during your speech. He or she may NOT speak during your election speech.
