

<u>Elk Grove Campus Dress Code</u> All clothing should be clean and in good condition.

LABEL ALL Outer Wear, Backpacks & Lunch Containers with Student's Name

<u>Tops</u>: collared shirts, plain & without logos (except CMP polos), <u>solid white, navy, burgundy (maroon), light blue.</u> Elk Grove Campus t- shirts are permitted as a part of the uniform.

- Team shirts are not dress code.
- Fieldtrip Shirts are burgundy only.
- Turtlenecks (either as a shirt or undershirt) are permitted in cold weather.
- Undershirts should be school colors (white, navy, burgundy, light blue).
- **Tank tops, spaghetti straps, and bare midriffs** are <u>not</u> permitted at any time.

<u>Sweatshirts and Sweaters:</u> Solid colors, same as the <u>uniform tops</u>: plain or with CMP logo.

• <u>Outdoor jackets are not permitted as classroom wear</u>. Provide an indoor sweatshirt or sweater <u>in uniform colors</u> (solid white, navy, burgundy, light blue).

<u>Bottoms</u>: <u>Plain</u> solid-color cotton pants, skirts, shorts, capris, skorts, and jumpers: <u>khaki, burgundy, or navy blue</u>.

- NO denim/jeans, leggings (as pants), nylon or stretch material permitted except on free-dress Fridays.
- Leggings worn under skirts are to be solid-color khaki, navy blue, brown, white, or black.
- At all times, the fit must be neither too tight nor too loose. No ripped or distressed pants.
- <u>Shorts and skirts must be as long as the student's finger</u> <u>tips</u> when arms are at their sides.

<u>Shoes:</u> Shoes are to be white, navy blue, black, grey, or brown.

- No sparkles or non-uniform colors except on free dress days. <u>No distracting decorations, lights, or wheels at any time.</u>
- Tennis shoes are preferred for safety on the playground. Flat loafers, oxfords, and <u>shoes with enclosed toe and heel</u> <u>strap</u> are permitted with non-slip soles.
- Heels, except for special occasions, are not permitted.

<u>Socks/Tights</u>: Socks and tights are to be white, navy blue, black, grey, or brown. No bright colors or designs except for free dress.

<u>Outdoor Coats and Jackets:</u> Any color is permitted but must be free of distracting media.

• Coats and jackets are <u>not to be worn inside the</u> <u>classrooms</u>. A sweater or sweatshirt in uniform colors should be provided for inside wear.

Jewelry, Hair, and Adornments:

- Jewelry should be simple, non-dangling in nature. (Keep in mind it can be very difficult to find lost jewelry in the sand or grass.)
- Hairstyles are to be neat and the student's <u>natural</u> color.
- Makeup in middle school is to be non-distracting.
- Hats, bandanas, scarves, and head-coverings are to be worn outside only.

Backpacks and Lunch Boxes:

• Decorations on these items are to be appropriate.

<u>Free-Dress Fridays!</u> Students earn Free-Dress Friday when they are in dress-code, have arrived to school on-time, and have been present for the entire school day, Monday through Thursday (i.e., no arriving late or leaving early for any reason, including medical or dental appointments). Please see the Principal with any questions.

- <u>CMP t-shirts (burgundy) are still required on field trips.</u>
- Free-dress clothing must be clean, neat, and fit properly. Again, no ripped or distressed pants.
- Shoes must be appropriate for play; no wheels, lights, or flip flops.
- T-shirt and sweatshirt decorations and pictures must be appropriate for school (e.g.: no action figures or wording depicting violence or drugs).

Dress Code Violations:

Children must follow the dress code every school day, except when approved for Free-Dress Friday. The first time a student is not dressed in dress code, a student will receive a verbal reminder. The second time a student is not dressed in dress code, a note will be sent home. The third time a student is not dressed in dress code; a parent will be called to deliver appropriate dress code attire. Students not wearing dress code attire Monday through Thursday will be unable to earn Free-Dress Friday that week.
