

25.4 CREDITS 2. Students who pass Algebra I, Geometry and/or Algebra II at Shelton Intermediate School will be given high school credit.

- 3. Students who pass a World Languages course in eighth grade at Shelton Intermediate School will be given high school credit.
- 4. Accounting and Computer Science courses do not fulfill the mathematics graduation requirement.
- 5. Students are required to complete 10 hours of community service per year, a total of 40 hours prior to graduation. Students will receive .1 credit for 10 hours of service each year. Students may not earn more than .1 credit per year for service. Students must submit a signed contract for themselves and their supervisor responsible for monitoring their hours. This contract must be approved by the Principal or their designee prior to beginning service hours.
- 6. The minimum course load per semester is 6.0 credits. Exceptions to this regulation must be approved by the Principal or student's Assistant Principal
- 7. A student will earn their diploma and may participate in the graduation ceremony only if all academic requirements and obligations are met.





Infinite Campus to Input Course Requests

Once logged in, select "More" from the column on the left, then "Course Registration", then "24-25 Shelton High School".










Infinite Campus, continued

Select "Add Course" to get started.

You can search by course name or course number.

The goal is to fill 52 to 60 course units, which is NOT 100% (it's actually 72-80%).

Be sure to also select a few that you label as "Alternate".

Click "Back" to view and print your Course Request List.

Have a parent or guardian sign your course request printout.

Submit the signed IC printout AND your signed Course Selection Worksheet to your homeroom teacher by Thursday, March 7th.



Final Thoughts on Course Selection

- Your 2024-2025 Course Requests should not be completed in one sitting during today's Advisory. Your printed and signed course request forms are due by March 7th.
- Be responsible for the SHS graduation requirements and your progress toward them.
- Understand that there is a difference between our SHS requirements and the requirements of others such as a specific college of interest, or the NCAA for DI & DII athletic eligibility.
- Discuss appropriate courses and levels with your teachers, family, and counselor.
- Think about overall workload and your other obligations when considering multiple rigorous courses. AP and college dual-enrollment classes can be extremely rewarding, but have college-level expectations and are less flexible than other courses.
- If you are selecting an AP and/or college dual-enrollment course, you must also submit those signed expectation forms. They are found on the SHS website and in the Program of Studies.
- Don't be afraid to try something new! We have a wide variety of offerings that we encourage students to explore for possible career pathways or just for fun!
