Welcome to our first parent newsletter! We hope to be able to send out a newsletter several times a year to give all parents a sense of the goings on at LCCPS from across the span of grades. We have so much going on-it's a challenge to keep up with it all, but we hope you find this enjoyable, helpful and connects you to the school in new ways.

Strategic Plan

Our strategic plan goals have focused on school culture for our students. Our teachers have started a monthly Leadership Recognition program - to nominate leaders from our student body from every grade and celebrate their impact on our school. We are also doing a Leadership and Growth Mindset Poster contest, where the winning posters will be put on display in our hallways. For our middle school students we are starting an "Artist in Residence" team to brighten our school with positive messages in a number of spots in the school. We continue to reward students through the marble jar approach to promote positive group environment and working together.

Another aspect of our school culture work involves our teachers. We recently completed a teacher survey that provided us with great feedback from our teachers about areas where we can improve our school. We will be revising our student and parent surveys this year as well in an effort to ensure your voices are heard every year.

Wellington Grant

We were thrilled to hear good news from the Wellington Foundation. They have awarded us a 25K grant this year to support our literacy programs, and the grant could end up being extended to a 50K grant each year for 6 years! This would help us in our efforts to provide a world class education for our students and support our teachers toward that goal.

Win-Win Discipline

This year marks the first year we have adopted Win-Win Discipline. We are already seeing some improvements in our ability to understand our students' point of view, and be able to take a "Same Side" approach as much as possible so that all students see our faculty as supportive. This training has involved our entire faculty, and we are looking forward to continue to work on this together to make sure our students have the best opportunity to learn and grow.

Parent Coffees

Our first few parent coffees are scheduled - all from 7:30-8:30am Kindergarten and K1 was on January 25 Grade 1 and 2 are February 15th Grade 3 and 4 are on March 22nd

Building updates

Repairs have been made to the bricks in the play area, and we continue to move forward in getting our building's brickwork repaired. We are hoping to work with the condo associations and the owner of Mill 5 to get this job done quickly.


Lockdown Training



MCAS is around the corner! As a school, we take great pride in the performance of our school and the tremendous effort our students put into showcasing what they have learned. MCAS 2.0 is online for all students in grades 3-8.

It is important that students take their time and do not rush through the test. They need to go back into the passage and find evidence for their answers. Students are asked to write an extended response that asks them to explain their thinking in writing. Assessments, like the MCAS tests, measure how well your child has learned the MA standards. The results of these assessments are used to evaluate the school as well as guide school improvement efforts.

Leader in Me!





PROCEDURE FOR DELAY/CANCELLATION DUE TO WEATHER CONDITION

If LCCPS has a late start, please note that students can start to get dropped off at 9:15AM.

In most circumstances, LCCPS will follow the Lowell public school decision on the delay or cancellation when the weather conditions dictate a change in the normal opening of the school.

A phone call will be made to alert all LCCPS families and staff of decisions about school cancellations, delays or early dismissals.

If school is delayed, we will NOT run our before school program. If we have an early dismissal, we will NOT run our after school programs.
