In New York State, there are three types of diplomas: a local diploma, Regents diploma, and Advanced Regents diploma. Each diploma requires students to take certain academic coursework and achieve passing scores on New York State Regents exams or other State-approved alternatives. All

students can earn a Regents or Advanced Regents diploma, but only students who meet specific criteria are eligible to graduate with a local diploma. In this workshop, the Office of Academic Policy and Systems will review what specific courses and exams your child must pass in order to earn each type of New York State high school diploma.
