












STEM ACADEMY

The PRE-MED Academy is a dynamic academic community in which students explore the various opportunities within the world of health and medicine. The 4 year course load provided to our PRE-MED students equips them with knowledge,



skills, and competencies to be successful in a premedical program at a university. PRE-MED students have the ability to be tracked as an IB (international baccalaureate) student where they can earn up to 30 college credits OR they can be tracked as a Medical Assisting Student where they will prepped to take a medical assisting licensing exam. PRE-MED students also have the ability to take AP, College Now, and other college credited courses. We have partnerships with both Farmingdale and St. Johns University.

PHILANTHROPY

The PRE-MED Academy has partnered with the Leukemia Lymphoma Society (LLS) to raise money for blood cancer research in hopes to advance treatment and help save lives. The PRE- MED Academy raises close to \$1.000 each year which is donated in full to the LLS. The "Stuck for a Buck" event allows us to raise the majority of our proceeds.

GRADUATION AND BEYOND

The Graduation rate of the Pre-Med Academy for the 19-20 school year was 98%. The overall graduation rate for John Adams High School was 82%. Our graduates end up at Queens College, York College ,Hunter College, SUNY Buffalo ,University of Bridgeport,SUNY Stony Brook, Hofstra, SUNY Old Westbury, Husson University,SUNY Alfred and MORE!

PRE-MED STUDENTS

All incoming freshman are officially inducted into the PRE-MED Academy through a pinning in ceremony where they will receive PRE-MED Academy Scrubs, Lab coat and lapel pin. PRE-MED students are also honored for their successes in attendance and academics at this ceremony.

HEALTHCARE CORE

Students will explore health careers while building skills and knowledge in communication techniques, computer literacy, leadership skills, and resource management.



FIRST AID/CPR

This course provides our students training in basic first aid procedures, including the first aid skills recommended by OSHA,CPR and AED. Students who complete the course qualify for the AHA Heartsaver First Aid with CPR and AED course completion card.



FARMINGDALE: MEDICAL TERMS

This college credit course introduces prefixes, suffixes, and word roots used in medicine. Topics are medical terms that relate to the anatomy, physiology, pathological conditions, and treatment of selected systems.



ST. JOHNS: ANATO-MY & PHYSIOLOGY

Moving beyond a basic understanding of how your body works this course will provide a comprehensive insight into all structures and functions and how your systems work together to keep you healthy- College Advantage



INTRO TO MEDICAL ASSISTING

This course specifically focuses on career orientation, medical terminology, safety, law and ethics, communications and interpersonal skills, community resources, health, and job preparedness, patient records, and health care insurance coverage.

MEDICAL ASSISTING 1 & 2

This course focuses on the clinical aspects of a medical assistant. Such skills include, medical/surgical assisting with the physical examinations, office surgery, electrocardiography, administration of medications, basic laboratory skills, assisting with diagnostic and therapeutic procedures, and specialized medical practice.

MEDIA & FINE ARTS ACADEMY

VIDEO PRODUCTION

Is an introduction class designed to provide students with artistic, creative and historical background in the fields of video, broadcasting, and film production. In addition, this course provides instruction and training in pre- production, production and post-production phases of project development. Students who are interested in a career in entertainment production have opportunities to explore the many jobs involved in the making of such productions.

CONCERT/BAND

Is an introduction class in which we will be practicing various styles and genres of concert band repertoire. The primary focus of this class will be to build a solid fundamental foundation for playing your instrument, reading and understanding rhythms and melody, and working on all aspects of musicality to become well-rounded musicians.

PHOTOGRAPHY

Is a course that focuses on understanding the basic operations and functions of a digital single lens reflex camera and the manipulation of its settings to achieve a specific result. Students will learn about photographic elements of art and principles of design, composition, and lighting. Students in this class will receive 3 college credits from SUNY Farmingdale

GRAPHIC DESIGN

This course deals with major areas of graphic communications, including advertising design, editorial design and package design. Students will learn how and when to use Adobe Illustrator, Photoshop and In design. Students will be able to experiment with typography, poster design, logo creation, t-shirt design, package design and more. This class will finish with a credential from Adobe and certiport.

YEARBOOK

This course is designed to develop students' skills in yearbook production by providing experiences in selected aspects of yearbook production. Students learn basic principles of yearbook production and develop skills that include writing copy, captions and headlines; digital photography; desktop publishing and using appropriate technology tools for media production.

JOURNALISM

This class is designed to introduce the student to the fundamental elements of news writing. In doing so, students will develop their writing, interviewing, business, and publication skills.

MUSIC PRODUCTION

Is a course that is designed to introduce students to recording techniques and the technology used to capture the sounds that make up everyday life. In today's world, we are enamored by video and audio content that many people use to generate a source of income either in the realm of music, or in "sound synthesis" to be used in movies and/or professional video; the information you will receive is what audio professionals use to make the multimedia projects we enjoy every day, come to life.

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VIRTUAL ENTERPRISE


Students will learn money management strategies that will help students make informed decisions regarding educational and career opportunities while also planning for their future.
