- In addition, students who are registered in low enrolled courses may have limited options for music.

World Language Skills

We support the development of the four skills in learning a world language:

Listening

• Music, conversations, audio comprehension, language lab

Speaking

• Dialogues, partner work

Reading

• Comprehension passages, news articles, authentic texts

Writing

• Start with a sentence and grow to paragraphs, create short books or stories

Students learn about the cultures of the different counties where the target languages are spoken

They study holidays, taste foods, and compare cultures of the US and other countries

JJMS Music

- ► Choir
- Discovering Music
- ► Band*
- ▶ Orchestra*

*This course provides students with lessons in addition to the regularly scheduled period.

6th Grade Music Options

Choir

- ☐ For students who love to sing
- ☐ Students sing a variety of musical genres and languages, learn music theory and history, and learn to read music using solfege syllables
- ☐ All Choir students showcase skills in two evening concerts
- ☐ Students are assessed individually on concert music and music notation, every trimester

Discovering Music

- ☐ For students who would like to explore music beyond traditional performance ensembles
- ☐ Students will study piano, ukulele, music history and theory, and computer composition
- ☐ All Discovering Music students showcase skills through composition

6th Grade Music Options

Band

- **For students who wish to continue study on their band instrument**
- Students are assessed individually throughout the year on concert music, etudes, rhythms and scales

Orchestra

- **❖** For students who wish to continue study on their string instrument
- ❖ Students are assessed individually throughout the year on concert music, etudes, rhythms and scales
- ❖ Band and Orchestra develop skills through experience with a variety of musical pieces
- **❖** Band and Orchestra students showcase skills in two evening concerts

We recommend that all Band and Orchestra students remain in the same performance area when transitioning to the middle school.

Lessons

- □ Students are assigned 8 lessons in a 12-week trimester. In most cases, students only miss the same class one time per trimester when attending their weekly required lessons. Lessons rotate just like in Elementary School.
- ☐ Lesson make-ups are available every Wednesday after school or by appointment.
- ☐ Lessons offer an opportunity to focus on work that cannot happen in the larger ensemble setting:
 - Students work on individual technique specific to their instrument, one-onone with the teacher
 - An opportunity for students to meet in sections to work collaboratively on their repertoire
 - Individualized assessment during lessons on scales, rhythms, and repertoire
 - Lessons offer an opportunity for differentiated instruction as students work on skills beyond grade-level repertoire

The Counseling Center

- ✓ Help parent and child navigate the 3 years of middle school
