



German Student Exchange Cultures with FDA

For two weeks, from Friday January 22, four Oranienburg High School Students immersed themselves in the life and culture of Harlem, USA. The visiting students attended classes at FDA and lived with FFDA Host families. In May, four student and a chaperone from the Frederick Douglass Academy will travel to Berlin, Germany, live and attend school with their German peers in Oranienburg. The exchange program is designed to overcome racial stereotypes and to broaden the minds of young people on both sides of the Atlantic Ocean. The exchange program is or-

ganized by Kennedy Williams-Benjamin, CEO of the Raina Storm Agency, sponsored by the Consulate General of the Federal Republic of Germany and the generous support of Lufthansa, who sponsored the tickets. During the week of January 25, Ms. Williams' student ambassadors met with some of New York's highest elected officials: Gov. David Paterson, City Comptroller John Liu, Public Advocate Bill De Blasio, Manhattan Borough President Scott Stringer, and Harlem Assemblyman Keith Wright.

Reach The World at PS 175 By Natasha Spann

The students and teachers of PS 175M participate in a program called *Reach the World*. This program uses interactive technology resources that link our students to travelers and bring global environments and cultures to life. Students have participated in SKYPE sessions through which they have communicated with travelers in Cameroon, Africa; Sao Paulo, Brazil; and Shanghai, China. Reach the World provides opportunities for real-life application of mathematics, literacy, science, and social studies skills and concepts. Our students have been able to make connections between the classroom and the real world that extend their learning beyond the limits of a textbook, thereby

making it more compelling and meaningful. Below are some examples of activities aligned with the major mathematics strands and travelers' journeys:

- * calculate rates, such as miles traveled per week, use maps to measure distance and make to-scale conversions.
- * use the travelers' longitude and latitude measurements to plot points on a grid.
- * The Logbooks and Travelers' Journals on Reach the World website make excellent read-alouds because of their unique combination of content and narrative form.

As the school year progresses, we look forward



to our students becoming increasingly literate in technology and enhancing their higher-order critical thinking skills as they discover the world beyond PS 175.
