General Information

In accordance with the Central Section Governing rules, Rule 7, the Central Section Play-offs shall be conducted in five (5) divisions as established by the State CIF and the Section Commissioner to have 16 team brackets, with the exception of D-VI in Football, which will have 8 teams. There will be no "Valley" Champion declared in any division. Each bracket will consist of 16 teams selected at a seeding meeting the Saturday after the final regular season Friday night contests.

I. General Information

Games Time:

Game Times for all play-off contests will be established by the CIF Central Section office, and will be posted on the section website and play-off brackets. They will only be changed in case of an emergency.

Game Site:

All games will be played at the highest seeded team's site provided that the site is adequate. The Section Office will determine the adequacy of a site/facility if there is a question.

Game Management:

It is the responsibility of the host team to provide ALL game management. The host school shall make all arrangements for the printing, distribution, sale and collection of tickets, security, seating and supervision. Visiting schools are expected to assist with crowd control and supervision of their student section.

Awards:

The CIF Central Section will provide a Championship and Runner-up plaque to each team competing in the finals of each division, along with medals and hats for the Championship team.

II. Equal Facilities

- A. Although it is necessary to designate one team the "host/home" team, it should be kept in mind that the game belongs equally to the competing team. A pre-game meeting should be arranged to carefully go over ALL details connected with holding the event.
- B. Each school should have equal dressing facilities and rooms for pre-game and half time and post game meetings.

III. Game Rules

- A. All play-off games will be played according to the National Federation Rule Book.
- B. The host school is to furnish a Spalding game ball. For Baseball Wilson balls will be used. In Water Polo the game ball will be Mikasa.
- C. The host school is to furnish the scorebook, scorekeeper, clock timer(s) and game timer as needed for each sport. These workers should be adults.
- D. The announcer should be a responsible adult who can properly set the tone for the contest and by calling the fans attention to the following points of reference:
 - 1) The CIF-CS play-off contest is to be conducted under the strictest code of fair play and sportsmanship.
 - 2) The officials have been selected because of their demonstrated ability by the association.
 - 3) Spectators are encouraged to SUPPORT their own team with positive Encouragement, but are requested to refrain from booing or using derogatory statements towards the opponents and officials.
 - 4) The P-A announcer should not do play by play as the action unfolds or be a cheerleader for the home team.
- E. The host "home" Team shall wear light uniforms and the guest team shall wear dark colored uniforms, EXCEPT FOOTBALL. National Federation Rules.

IV. Bands and Pep Squads

Pep bands are limited to fifteen (15) members of the host school, for games played in gymnasiums. They will be admitted free, provided they have their instrument. An advisor will be admitted to the contest free of charge and must accompany pep band members. At football games, both bands may share half time, and half time may be lengthened to 20 minutes.

Pep squad members are admitted free provided they are dressed in the appropriate uniform and are accompanied by an advisor.

No electronic amplified instruments or artificial noisemakers such as, but not limited to, cow bells, whistles, air horns, thunder sticks, etc., will be allowed at the indoor contests.

V. Administrative Responsibilities

The "host" principal, or his/her delegated administrative assistant shall be responsible for seeing that all financial regulations pertaining to the play-offs, such as admission prices, game expenses, financial statements, etc., are strictly followed.

A. Admission Prices:

Admission prices shall be prescribed by the Central Section and are as follows:

B. Tickets:

The host school is responsible for issuing tickets. The standard stock roll type ticket may be used if properly numbered, and stamped with the school name, and price. The host school should contact the visiting school as to the number of pre-sale tickets desired. Host school management MUST save 1/3 of the total tickets for the visiting team.

C. Passes:

REGULAR SEASON CIF Complimentary passes (BLUE-BOYS VB SCENE) are **VOID** at play-off games. Metal engraved CIF Lifetime passes (BLUE & NEW SILVER), Metal engraved State CIF Lifetime passes (GOLD), State CIF Courtesy Cards (Red & Gold) CIF Play-off passes (GREEN GOLF SCENE) are valid. BOOSTER SEASON PASSES; STAFF PASSES AND DISTRICT PASSES ARE NOT VALID AT PLAY-OFF GAMES.

D. Gate Procedures:

- 1. Personnel assigned to gate duty should be courteous and pleasant, but **VERY FIRM**. This assignment is most important to the financial success of the play-off game. The visiting school may also assign a staff member to assist in the supervision (not ticket taking) at the entrance to help the host team with the visiting fans.
- 2. Ticket takers should be made aware of the only type of tickets to be accepted for admission (color, school name. etc.). Collected tickets MUST be deposited in a safe place for accounting purposes and to prevent use at other events.
- 3. The ticket booths should open approximately one hour prior to the start of the contest. Football gates need to be opened two hours before kick-off.
- 4. It is extremely important to have an adult located at all of the potential "other" entrances to the facility to assist in keeping non-paying customers from gaining entrance.

VI. Financial Report

- A. A standard form issued by the CIF Central Section Office, and the check for the CIF share of the play-off game gate, MUST be completed by the host school and returned to the CIF office within 30 days of the play-off game. A check and a copy of the financial statement to the visiting school MUST also be sent in that time period. FAILURE TO SEND THE FINANCIAL STATEMENT AND CHECK TO THE CENTRAL SECTION AND VISITING SCHOOL COULD RESULT IN THE LOSS OF HOSTING CIF CENTRAL SECTION CHAMPIONSHIP EVENTS FOR ONE YEAR.
- B. The financial report form is self-explanatory and should be accurately completed and signed by the principal of the host school. This report will itemize all game receipts and expenditures, and will indicate the division of profits to CIF and the competing schools.



Official Balls For Play-offs

The following balls **MUST** be used in CIF Central Section play-off games.

Failure to use the contracted ball will result in the loss of the offending schools game revenue and the ability to host games. Results of games played with a non-contracted ball will stand and the offending school/s will Lose their right to host their next play-off game in that sport. If the offending school lost that school will lose the right to host their next home game in the following year's play-offs.

Radio/Television Broadcasts: Live TV, Internet or pod casts MUST BE NEGOTIATED, through the CIF Section office.

The CIF Central Section retains the broadcasting rights and cable and webcasting rights for all play-off contests, and permission for the same must be secured from the CIF Central Section Commissioner, at least one week in advance of the contest. Radio broadcasts may be live. Upon completion of a contract with the CIF Central Section Office, the section will notify the host school.

News report film or videotape of any CIF-CS contest is permissible, without payment or fee or prior approval.

Protocols for Championship Ceremony at Finals

- 1. At a time out within the last minute of the game, politely...but **FIRMLY**, inform the crowd and media that there will be a brief awards presentation immediately following the game and that all spectators are to remain in the stands until after the ceremony.
- 2. As soon as the game ends and the teams have shaken hands, each team should go to its own bench and line up for the awards.
- 3. Teams are requested to face each other from their respective benches and be courteous and attentive as the awards are presented.

It is understandable that the runner up will be disappointed, but they should Step forward quickly and receive their award and then step back and refrain from inappropriate gestures or demonstration while the winning team is being honored.

4. CIF Officials will present Plaques to the team representatives in the brief ceremony. If possible, have a microphone available for the CIF Official who will be presenting the awards. After the awards have been received by both teams' spectators may then join their respective teams.
