# Why is this Project Proposed?

- Age of current facilities—Average age of facilities is 55.25 years
- Infrastructure updates—lighting, electrical, gas, HVAC, and plumbing
- Abate asbestos in current facilities
- New Programs and Space Requirements—Agriculture/Science, Choir, Broadcast Journalism, Life Skills, Art (All Levels), Pre-Kindergarten
- General Update of restrooms, hallways, classrooms, and locker rooms (school wide) is needed


### PROJECTED IMPACT ON TAXES

In 2015, our taxable property values increased from \$84,930,671 to \$356,444,142, and are projected to increase to as much as \$614,505,616 by 2018.

If the bond proposition is approved by the voters, financed over 20 years, the estimated I&S tax rate to service the bonds, based on anticipated taxable values, would be 32.6 cents per \$100 of assessed valuation for 2017, 7.6 cents above the current I&S rate of 25 cents in 2016. If financed over a 25 year period, the estimated I&S tax rate would be 30.4 cents per \$100 of assessed valuation in 2017, 5.4 cents above the current I&S rate of 25 cents in 2016.\*
