## Observations of the Comprehensive Needs Assessment for Program Improvement Survey 2015-2016

The most important part of our school is students. Our responsibility is to provide an effective curriculum that will equip these students with the skills and expertise to be successful after graduation, whether they enter the military, the job force, or continue their education through a technical school, college, or university. The environment in which these students are taught must be conducive to learning. For this reason, we must constantly be refining our tools, refining our strengths, and improving our weaknesses. The following strengths and weaknesses were identified based on the survey for Comprehensive Needs Assessment for Program Improvement by our teaching staff in the areas of demographics, student achievement, school culture and climate, staff quality/professional development, curriculum and instruction and assessment, family and community involvement, school context and organization and technology:

#### I. Demographics

**Strengths:** Based on the survey for Needs Assessment for Program Improvement, our teachers were able to analyze student demographics, attendance, and achievement data. A score of 4.98% was attained in this category. At the beginning of the year, every teacher is given a form titled "Demographic Student Information". This form is used throughout the year because it gives the teacher information on students' TELPAS, LAS Link scores, STAAR Scores (4<sup>th</sup>-5<sup>th</sup>) special populations, end of the year scores, attendance, parents' names, address, identification number, and phone numbers. Teachers know the demographic breakdown of their classroom and can identify struggling students based on the data from the very first day of school.

**Weaknesses:** Based on the survey for Needs Assessment for Program Improvement, no needs were indicated by the teachers. Teacher feedback indicates that they are knowledgeable in the demographics of their classroom from the very first day of school.

#### **II. Student Achievement**

**Strengths:** Test data is disaggregated daily, weekly and the end of the six weeks after the administration of the benchmarks. Mrs. M. Silva, facilitator, on a weekly basis gives teachers a form for weekly test data analysis and provides teachers with DMAC assessment data for benchmarks on a timely manner to facilitate instructional planning for students that are struggling. During the Professional Learning Communities meetings, every Wednesday, Mrs. O. E. García, Ms. M E. Treviño and Mrs. M. Silva, analyze weekly test or/and benchmark assessments with the teachers. A score of 4.96% was attained in this category.

**Weaknesses:** Based on the survey for Needs Assessment for Program Improvement, no needs were indicated by the teachers. One teacher commented that, "high expectations are emphasized all year long. Students and teachers are expected to perform and attain the highest, academic achievements". Based on our STAAR scores results, all areas will be targeted for improvement (reading, math, science and writing). These areas will be emphasized for the upcoming school year. All areas need to be addressed and monitored more effectively in all grade levels.

#### III. School Culture and Climate

**Strengths:** Based on the Survey for Needs Assessment for Program Improvement, School Culture and Climate received a 4.99%. Teachers' interactions are positive and lead to student success. Teachers know that high expectations and emphasis on academic achievement are communicated to students and parents. All of our school staff members believe that all students can and will learn. A teacher stated in her survey that she enjoyed working in the school because of the positive and cordial behavior and attitude by teachers and administration. "Good team collaboration over all", was stated by more than five teachers.

**Weaknesses:** Based on the survey for Needs Assessment for Program Improvement, no needs were indicated by the teachers. We will be working on promoting parental involvement in the school by having a room assessable to the parents with supplies and material to help teachers with anything they may need in the classroom like flashcards, posters, copies, etc.

#### IV. Staff Quality/Professional Development

**Strengths:** A highly qualified and highly trained staff is perhaps the most important factor in the teaching-learning equation. State law has required teachers to be degreed and certified in the areas to which they are assigned. While appropriate certification is important, experience and relevant professional development are also essential and must be considered when evaluating staff. Every Wednesday, in our campus, we have professional learning communities (PLC's) where the principal, assistant principal and facilitator meet with teachers as a grade level to give them professional development training and updates on the state assessment STAAR. This year teachers were sent to Region one for Sheltered Instruction, Vocabulary Development and ELPS training. Also, some training for our ELL's was held at Roma High School Library.

**Weaknesses:** Based on the survey for Needs Assessment for Program Improvement, staff quality and professional development our campus received a score of 4.90% in this domain from our teachers. Some of our teacher's feel they need to be sent out to Region I workshops/trainings or conferences to count for professional development. Our observation shows, that a large percentage of our teachers have less than nine years teaching experience. Our staff is

comprised of a fairly young group of teachers that need more experience in how lessons can be differentiated and where integration of different subject matter can be more effective. More opportunities for staff development will be provided to teacher for the different populations especially our Limited English Proficient Students.

#### V. Curriculum & Instruction and Assessment

**Strengths:** Based on the Needs Assessment for Program Improvement Survey for Curriculum & Instruction and Assessment received a 4.98%. Teachers effectively implement a variety of instructional methods and strategies to keep students successfully engaged in appropriate learning levels. Our teachers promote and carefully monitor new practices when it comes to curriculum alignment, student assessment and professional training. Teachers' instructional objectives, activities, materials, and assessments are aligned with Federal and State educational programs. New resources were provided to the teachers so they can in turn prepare students for local and state assessments.

**Weaknesses:** Based on the survey for Needs Assessment for Program Improvement, no needs were indicated by the teachers. Teachers did comment that good team collaboration over all was observed in the campus when it comes to curriculum and instruction. We will continue to meet with teacher weekly to promote student learning and empower teachers with ideas and strategies to be used in the classroom.

#### **VI. Family and Community Involvement**

**Strengths:** Parental Involvement is very important in the learning process of our students. Our campus received a percentage of 4.86% in this domain. In order to promote family and community involvement, communication with the parents is done in the primary language. Parents are informed of their responsibilities for the success of their children using various methods such as students' handbook, trainings, meetings, website, local media, teacher conferences, and open house. Procedures for parental involvement are clearly communicated to parents and used consistently. Parents are encouraged to meet with teachers or administrators to help their child in school.

**Weaknesses:** Based on the survey for Needs Assessment for Program Improvement, no needs were indicated by our teachers. Based on observations throughout the year, more parental involvement in our parent center is needed. Monthly meetings are held for parents on various topics to help them be aware of their child needs.

#### VII. School Context and Organization

**Strengths:** A factor in a successful teaching-learning process that we will consider is the facilities in which the process is carried out. Under this domain, our school received a percentage of 4.92%. Facilities include more than the building, i.e., equipment, supplies, and materials needed to enhance the instruction provided by the teachers. Our facility is fairly new and meets safety standards for all students and staff. An integral part of the decision making process at the campus is the Site Based Decision Making Committee.

**Weaknesses:** The custodial staff has been working very hard to maintain the campus in utmost condition. Problems with the plumbing of sections of the building distract from the teaching-learning process. Our gym does not have air condition and it must remain completely open during the school day. This invites unwelcome guests, (i.e., bats, bees, rattle snake, black beetles).

#### VIII. Technology

**Strengths:** The delivery of instruction is enhanced through the integration of technology at the classroom level. In Pre-Kindergarten classes we have four tablets and one Hatch computer. We have 6 IPads in Kindergarten and four computers for each 1<sup>st</sup> - 5<sup>th</sup> grade classrooms. All classrooms have an LCD Projector, a smart board and a laptop. Teachers make effective use of available hardware and software to enhance the delivery of instruction. Infrastructure and networks are updated and upgraded as needed.

**Weaknesses:** Based on the survey for Needs Assessment for Program Improvement, this domain received a 4.80%. New headphones were purchased this year. We will continue to upgrade and replace technology as needed. Technology Professional Development will be provided to teachers.

#### SCHOOL-WIDE PROGRAM PLAN

Roel A. and Celia R. Saenz Elementary School uses its Title I, Part A and other federal funds to upgrade the entire instructional program by implementing a school-wide program as authorized under the provisions of Public Law 107-110. We conducted a comprehensive needs assessment and observations over a period of one year to determine the strengths and needs of students, staff, parental involvement, community involvement, and facilities before deciding how to use the local, state, and federal resources available. Based on that assessment it was decided to concentrate on improving the passing rate of all students and all student groups on the STAAR. The long-range goal is to have at least 90 percent of all students and all student groups passing all parts of the STAAR by spring of 2017 administration.

Highly qualified teachers will carry out the instructional program. Only teachers who are certified by the State to teach the subjects/grade levels to which they are assigned will be recommended by the school. The school will consider teachers who have

Alternative Certifications. The school will provide access to high-quality ongoing professional development throughout the school year for all staff including teachers, principals, and paraprofessionals. Professional development activities will be geared to individual teachers' specialties and needs as determined by the staff. Professional development will be conducted both at the school and the education service center as well as applicable conferences and workshops and will be intensive and sustained.

Teachers will be helping in making decisions regarding the use of academic assessments to measure student performance. Teachers will use data obtained from the STAAR, as well as other instruments, including but not limited to, the TPRI and readiness tests to implement new instructional strategies, modify existing strategies, and/or discontinue existing strategies to better address student needs as determined by use of these instruments.

Students experiencing difficulty in mastering the STAAR will be provided effective, timely additional assistance. All teachers will closely monitor all students' performance based on daily exercises and periodic tests. Students not mastering the objectives will be provided additional assistance in the tutorial program, or the remedial reading program based on his/her individual nee

#### **SCHOOL-WIDE PROGRAM PLAN (Cont.)**

Alternative instructional strategies will be timely based on the teacher's evaluation of objective data and professional judgment. The school will coordinate and integrate federal, state, and local programs and services to maximize the effectiveness of these resources. Title IV funds are used to provide a curriculum that is designed to prevent drug abuse and violence by involving parents and the community. Professional development activities are also paid for them from Title IV funds. Title V funds are used to provide professional development in the use of new software and hardware and to purchase new software and hardware for the computer lab and computer assisted instruction (CAI) program and or programs for computers in the classrooms.

Other federal programs, in addition to those described above, used to fund the school wide program include Title I, Part C Migrant Education Program to identify and recruit children of migratory workers for supplemental services designed to reduce the educational disruptions and other problems that result from repeated moves and Title III to provide supplemental services to help ensure that children who are limited English proficient attain English language proficiency and develop high levels of academic attainment. Other state programs, in addition to those described above, include Bilingual Education used to obtain special materials to enhance the bilingual program.


