

<u>Reading</u> – Your child will identify compare and contrast relationships within a text. Your child will analyze and evaluate information provided by an author and explain how the information contributes to an understanding of the text in which it appears.

<u>Math-</u> Your child will understand how to use operations with whole numbers to solve problems. They will make sense of a multi-step word problem and keep working until it is solved.

Writing- Your child will expand their knowledge of informational writing by researching a topic and finding facts, definitions, concrete details, or other relevant information. They will include text features when useful for aiding comprehension. Students will Introduce a topic clearly and organize related information in paragraphs and sections, use precise language and content-specific vocabulary, use transitional words and phrases to connect ideas within categories of information, and provide a concluding statement or section related to the information presented.

Science- Your child will investigate the role animal senses play in their survival and then try to understand a realistic fictional problem with a real organism.

Social Studies- Your child will begin to explore the events, procedures, ideas and concepts that led to the American Revolution in a historical text.
