2018-2019 Chief Manuelito Student Dress Code

Students are expected to show pride in attire and dress for learning while on campus or on school sponsored activities and field trips. Students will dress in a manner which follows guidelines, is healthy, is safe and takes into consideration the welfare of self and others. Interpretation of the following dress code is subject to administrative discretion and follows district policy for student dress code.

Shirts:

- 1. Solid colors, long/short sleeve polo shirt in green, black, pink, orange, yellow, maroon, white or gray.
- 2. School Spirit T-shirts (administrative approved) on specific spirit days. No low-cut in front or see-through. NOTE: Shirts worn out can be no longer than finger-tip length. Administration will allow polo shirts w/stripes but polo shirt stripes cannot be red or blue in color. No muscle shirts, shredded or frayed shirts.
- 3. Students can wear school sweatshirt over their solid color polo shirt. Sweaters on sale in the school office.
- 4. Shirts /tops which are low-cut, off-the-shoulder, shredded, frayed, muscle shirts, or show midriff are NOT allowed.

Pants:

- 1. Khaki slacks, khaki dress pants, solid black slacks or black dress pants. No blue, red or other colors.
- 2. A style that is not cargo (no pockets below mid-thigh), sweat pants, or warm ups.
- 3. A style that is not saggy, baggy, or oversized pants (Pants must be worn at waist and FIT properly).
- 4. Denim jeans on school principal approved spirit days (Jeans must be clean and neat).
- 5. Distressed, ripped or torn jeans are NOT allowed at school (No frayed or shredded jeans or leggings).
- NO Tights or leggings and tight fitting jeans are NOT allowed at school.
 NOTE: No skin should be shown between the bottom of the shirt and the top of the pants, shorts, or Capri pants when arms are stretched upward.

Other Attire:

- 1. Sweatshirts need to be the same color as dress approved polo or have CMMS logo. NO JACKETS OR HOODIES ALLOWED IN THE SCHOOL BUILDING.
- 2. Shorts are acceptable as long as they are; khaki or black in color, not cargo in style and have an inseam with a minimum of 4 inches and do not hang below knees. Shorts and skirts should not be more than 3 inches above the knee when standing straight.
- 3. Capri Pants and Skirts are acceptable if they are; khaki or black in color, not a miniskirt and not 3 inches above the knee when standing straight.
- 4. Belts: Must fit around the waist, be secured in belt loops and not extend more than six inches beyond the buckle. No blue or red belts.
- 5. Outerwear (jackets, bandanas, hairnets, hats, gloves, sunglasses and scarves) are for outside use only. JACKETS must be TAKEN OFF in the building unless circumstances permit them to be allowed to be worn in the building per administrative approval. Trench coats and over coats are strictly prohibited and NOT allowed on school campus or inside the building.
- 6. Shoes: Due to safety, we do not permit flip flops, sandals or high heels. Shoe laces cannot be red or blue.
- 7. Undershirts: Worn underneath polo shirt and tucked in and cannot be red, blue or have other logos.
- 8. Accessories: Red and Blue belts, shoestrings or any accessories with these colors are not allowed. We do not allow accessories advertising drugs/alcohol or other inappropriate logos.
- Pajamas, slippers and other clothing not normally worn in school or public setting is NOT allowed. EXCEPTIONS: Spirit days, school picture days or health considerations and must be approved by administration.

Prohibited Items: (NOT allowed)

- 1. Accessories including; studded bracelets, belts, necklaces, belt loop, chain wallets, chains that connect body piercings.
- 2. Pins, clothing, tattoos/accessories advertising or promoting drugs/tobacco/alcohol, sexual innuendo, violence, weaponry, disruptive symbols, profanity, hate/bigotry toward groups, offensive, disrespectful to other individuals will not be allowed.
- 3. Clothing which displays; gang affiliation; abuse or illicit inappropriate behavior is not allowed.
- 4. Safety pins, straight pins, paperclips or similar objects used as decorations or accessories on any type of attire. These objects may be considered weapons.
- 5. Body piercing jewelry is at the discretion of administration. Students may be asked to take off body piercing jewelry including; tongue piercing, lip piercing and eyebrow piercing jewelry. Administration may ask students to remove body piercing jewelry due to student safety. Refusal to remove jewelry will result in administration following the discipline policy set by the school board and school district.
