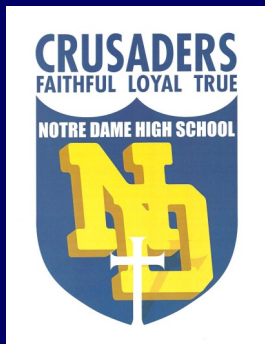

Veteran's Day & "Above the Best - Class of 1964-Ed Mullins Memorial Scholarship"

Congratulations to the entire ND community for our wonderful Veteran's Day Mass and Celebration held on November 16. Father Butera celebrated the Mass and welcomed approximately 15 veteran's from our ND community and their family and friends. It was a tremendous way to say "Thank You" during the Thanksgiving season to those who helped to protect the freedoms we all enjoy in our country today. After the Mass we honored Michael Mullins, Class of 1964, with the first "Salute to Veterans" award for his service during the Vietnam war and his family's sacrifice. Michael's twin brother, Edward Patrick Mullins, was killed in action while attempting to rescue fellow service men. He remains Notre Dame's only alumni who was killed during the Vietnam War. In honor of the sacrifice of the Mullins family, the Class of 1964 has awarded a memorial scholarship each year. On November 16, the class members, some traveling from as far away as Oregon, presented the 2017 "Above the Best" scholarship to Christopher Bianchi, a current junior at Notre Dame HS. Scholarships for 2017-18 Academic Year

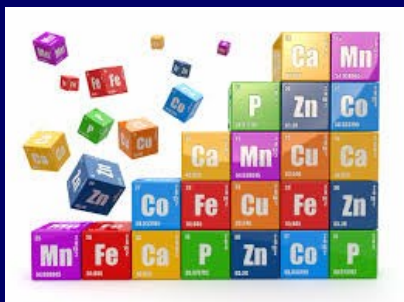

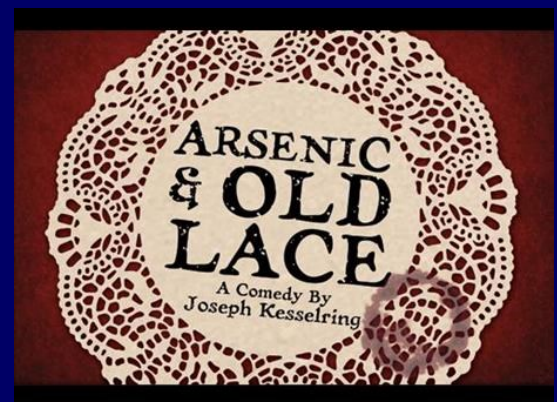

Senior Reminders Regarding Naviance/Family Connection

Step 1) Submit your Application via the Common App (Commonapp.org), or a regular application directly to the institution online.

Step 2) In your Family Connection account, under *Colleges I'm Applying To*, update the section that asks **Have you Applied** - This is the first step in the transcript request process.

Step 3) On that same page in Family Connection, above your college list, **request transcripts** for the colleges you've submitted your applications.

Be aware of application due dates. Make sure you're requesting your transcripts and other documents in Family Connection with at least 3 school days before your application deadline. It's always a good idea to reach out to the colleges directly through email or phone to clear up any confusion, or to check the status of your application.

As Seniors begin to receive Admissions decisions from colleges, feel free to update the **results** section, found next to each college on your *Colleges I'm Applying To List*. Or, stop in the Guidance Office and let us know the good news.

Class of 2018 Scholarship Search

Seniors, don't forget to use the Scholarship Search available in your Family Connection account.

Students should know how to access their Family Connection accounts by going to:

If you need a reminder what your login information is, contact the Guidance Office and we can help.

Once you log in, from the home page click the *Colleges* tab. Then, scroll down towards the bottom on the page and you'll see the category *Scholarships and Money*. There you will find local and national scholarships using the *National Scholarship Search* hosted by *Sallie Mae*. Parents and students will probably want to look at this together as there are a number of questions that pertain to both.

Requesting transcripts

If you need to meet a January 1st college application deadline, please request your transcripts as soon as possible. Waiting until the last minute, could delay receipt of your application materials due to high school and college offices closed for Christmas. *Reminder- if a student needs a teacher letter of recommendation, they must speak to that teacher in person before submitting the request via Naviance.

As seniors begin to hear back from colleges with admissions decisions, please keep your Counselor up to date. We would love to share your good news and congratulate you for your accomplishment!

Kaplan to teach SAT Test Prep course after school at Notre Dame

Parents of 10th and 11th graders- I'd like to thank you for your participation in the *SAT Prep survey we sent back in October*. This survey helped us determine that there is an interest in additional SAT prep for our 10th and 11th grade students.

Notre Dame High School has partnered with Kaplan Test Prep to offer a preparation course at a special price available to our families. The SAT class will prepare your child for the March and May 2018 test dates, and will cost \$350. Students must register by Thursday, January 11, 2018.

PSAT Scores Coming back this month

On December 12, 2017, all students who took the PSAT's will be able to access their *PSAT/SAT Suite of Assessment scores with personalized feedback, practice, college planning and career exploration resources*.

Be on the lookout for an email from College Board that week prompting students to create an online College Board account to view this PSAT score report. This one CB account is for everything, including SAT, AP, PSAT/NMSQT, CLEP, and BigFuture activities, so please make sure you provide complete and accurate information. Also, write down your login information so you'll remember it.

Create a College Board Account

Once you create your account and view your PSAT score report you'll be able to see your scores and if you are on track for college readiness, view detailed explanations of skills required to be college ready and send your scores to Khan Academy for personalized practice recommendations.

This is the same account you'll use to sign up for the SAT's when you're ready to take them.

Connect with Khan Academy with College Board

Another important step for students who took the October PSAT is to connect their College Board and Khan Academy accounts. That way, when they get their PSAT/NMSQT scores on December 12, they can log in to Khan Academy and get a personalized SAT practice plan.

CIU 20 Driver Ed Program

On-the-Road Instruction

This training consists of six (6) 1-hour sessions one-on-one with an instructor. Driver training cars are provided by CIU20. A student must have his/her driving permit in order to take part in this instruction, as required by the state.

The On The Road program will take several months to complete. We will attempt to start your child's On-the -Road instruction as soon as possible but please be aware that there may be significant wait period of up to 2 months.

The student will drive with our instructors adapting new aptitudes. Parents are then expected to supplement this instruction with a minimum of 65 hours of instruction, as required by PennDOT, A Classroom Theory course is only required for on-the-road instruction if the student wishes to obtain his/her license through CIU20. They may take the classroom theory course at the same time they are learning with our instructors and practicing with their parents. Upon successful completion of a classroom theory course/classroom course and our on-the-road instruction and the 65 hours. The student may take the final PennDOT licensing exam with one of our instructors. No student will be eligible for testing with a CIU 20 instructor unless the on the road CIU 20 instructor approves the testing. Students in their senior year of high school, must complete the final end-of-course skills test to obtain one's license by August 20th of the calendar year in which they graduate.

Cost: \$275 for six (6) 1-hour lessons

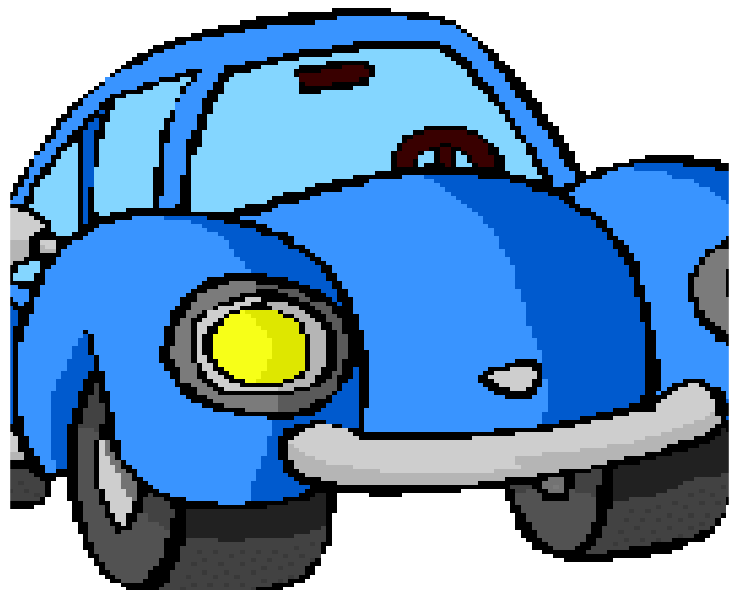
