



Students with Disabilities – 9.7%





Math

New 3-K Special Class in an Integrated Setting (SCIS) PS 156

District 23 is part of the citywide pilot expansion that will provide a new, developmentally appropriate option for our youngest learners with special needs to learn alongside their typically developing peers.

Each SCIS class will have 15 students, 1 general education teacher, 1 special education teacher, and 2 paraprofessionals.

P.S. 155 takes pride in offering a Spanish Dual Language program in Kindergarten this school year, as they continue to highlight language and cultural diversity as valuable assets in their school community. The ASD Nest Model is a fully inclusive therapeutic environment designed for autistic students who are able to do grade-level academic work when provided the necessary support. This is a strengths-based model utilizing positive support strategies, targeted instructional strategies and specialized social interventions to make inclusion work well for all learners in the classroom. The ASD Nest school and district provide the necessary structures for the model, such as; smaller class size, co-taught classes, regular interdisciplinary team meetings to promote consistency across all settings, and strong home-school collaboration.
