

Your School District

The Uniondale Union Free School District is a community of approximately 25,092 people. Within the District's perimeter are parts of the communities of Baldwin, Hempstead, Westbury and all of Uniondale. The five elementary, two middle and one high school are located on 73 acres of land with an estimated value of \$198,483,150. Approximately 704 teachers and administrators are employed by the District.

A five-member Board of Education, elected by the qualified voters of the District and serving without pay, manages the schools. At least one member is elected each spring. Meetings of the School Board are held on specific Tuesdays as listed on the calendar at 7:00 pm in Uniondale High School unless otherwise specified. Residents are invited to attend.

Attendance

Attending school and achieving are the primary jobs of every student. Good work habits must be formed to succeed at a chosen vocation and to become a responsible adult. Irregular attendance is often the prelude to dropping out of school; persistent truancy is the forerunner of delinquency. Good scholarship is dependent on regular attendance. Parents owe their children the duty of seeing that they are in school every day unless there is a valid reason for absence.

The attendance record follows the child after graduation. It is furnished to colleges along with the academic record and is frequently requested by employers many years after graduation. It is generally considered an indication of a student's reliability. The State Education Law lists the following classifications as legal absences or tardiness:

- 1. Sickness of student.
- 2. Death in family.
- 3. Impassable roads or weather making travel unsafe.
- 4. Religious observance (under rules established by Education Law).
- 5. Religious instruction (1 hour per week upon parent request).
- 6. Required presence in court.
- 7. Approved college visits
- 8. Quarantine
- 9. Military Obligations

All other absences are classified as unlawful detention (on the part of the parent) or truancy. Tardiness from the standpoint of the law is absence.

Parents are requested to advise the school by telephone on the first day of the reason for the child's absence or lateness.

Each day represents a significant monetary investment in every boy and girl enrolled in school. State and Federal aid depend on a child's attendance and have a definite effect on the school budget and district taxation. *Please see UHS code of conduct for the UHS attendance and add/drop policy.

When A Question Arises

When a question arises in the mind of a parent relative to the progress of the child in school, the District Administration has a plan for answering such questions. If the question concerns the progress of a child in a particular class, the parent is urged to contact the teacher.

If the question concerns the overall progress of the child in school, there are other sources. On the elementary level, the building principal may be contacted. On the secondary level, the guidance counselors, assistant principal and principal, in that order, may be contacted.

Since school personnel have schedules to follow during the day, parents are asked to phone the school for an appointment in advance. The phone numbers of the schools are listed with the individual schools in this publication.

Parental Involvement

In addition to encouraging parental involvement through a variety of organizations, such as the PTA Council and individual PTA units, District policy encourages parents to become, and remain involved, in the education of their children. When a parent develops a particular interest or concern, or a problem arises in relation to the education of a child, the parent(s) is encouraged to contact the child's teacher, a building administrator, and support staff such as school counselors. If questions or concerns cannot be resolved at the building level, parents are also encouraged to contact the Assistant Superintendent for Curriculum and Instruction or the Superintendent of Schools. The District believes that the school and parents must work together so that children can gain as much as possible from their educational experience in Uniondale .In accordance with School Board Policy 5500 and the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (FERPA), Uniondale Public Schools staff must allow parents/guardians and/or eligible students to:

- 1. inspect and review the student's education records;
- 2. request that records be amended to ensure that they are not inaccurate, misleading, or otherwise in violation of the student's privacy or other rights;
- 3. consent to disclosure of personally identifiable information contained in the student's education records, except to the extent that FERPA authorizes disclosure without consent; and
- 4. file a complaint with the U.S. Department of Education alleging failure of the district to comply with FERPA and its regulations

PPRA Model Notice And Consent/OPT-Out For Specific Activities

The Protection of Pupil Rights Amendment (PPRA), 20 U.S.C. #1232h, requires the Uniondale School District to notify you and obtain consent or allow you to opt your child out of participating in certain school activities. These activities include a student survey, analysis, or evaluation that concerns one or more of the following eight areas ("protected information surveys"):

- 1. Political affiliations or beliefs of the student or student's parent;
- 2. Mental or psychological problems of the student or student's family;
- 3. Sex behavior or attitudes;
- 4. Illegal, anti-social, self-incriminating, or demeaning behavior;
- 5. Critical appraisals of others with whom respondents have close family relationships;
- 6. Legally recognized privileged relationships, such as with lawyers, doctors, or ministers;
- 7. Religious practices, affiliations, or beliefs of the student or parents; or
- 8. Income, other than as required by law to determine program eligibility. This requirement also applies to the collection, disclosure or use of student information for marketing purposes ("marketing surveys"), and certain physical exams and screenings.

Title IX and Section 504 Compliance

The Uniondale Union Free School District does not discriminate on the basis of sex, race or handicap in the educational programs or activities which it operates. Title IX of the Federal Education Amendments of 1972 requires educational institutions to maintain policies, practices and programs that do not discriminate against anyone based on sex,to create gender equitable schools. Inquiries or complaints concerning the application of of Section 504 regulations may be referred to Myrtle E. Section 504 provides that no qualified individual with a disability should, only by reason of his or her disability, be excluded from the participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any program or activity receiving Federal financial assistance. Inquiries or complaints concerning the application of Section 504 regulations may be referred to Carol DelValle, Administrative Assistant for Special Services/CSE, Cornelius Court School, 1060 Cornelius Court, Uniondale, New York 11553, telephone (516) 560-8861. All complaints of violation of non-compliance with said law or regulations shall be committed in writing to the above-named employees and shall be promptly investigated. Such hearings or other procedures on any and all such complaints shall be promptly taken as shall be necessary to enable the prompt and equitable resolution of student and employer complaints alleging any action which would be prohibited by said law or regulation.

Annual "AHERA" Notification

In compliance with federal regulation 40CFR Part 763 (AHERA), the Uniondale UFSD continues its management plan of the remaining asbestos containing materials in the district. Planned activities for the upcoming school year include custodial and maintenance employee awareness training and continuation of the six-month surveillance program. Records of employee training,inspections, surveillances and abatement projects are available for review in the district office and in the main office of each school.

Transportation

A. PUBLIC SCHOOL CHILDREN

The District provides transportation for children according to the following distances which were established by the voters at an Annual Meeting: Grades K-3 Beyond 1/2 mile from school to home Grades 4-6 Beyond 3/4 miles from school to home Grades 7-12 Beyond 1-1/2 miles from school to home Children who are entitled to bus transportation are notified by the individual schools. Parents who have questions relative to transportation should contact the individual school principal.

B. PRIVATE AND PAROCHIAL SCHOOL CHILDREN

Children attending private and parochial schools are guided by the same rules that govern transportation for public school children. The cost of transportation to all approved private and parochial schools up to a distance of 15 miles is paid by the School District. Parents of parochial and private school children must request transportation by April 1st of each year. But prior to requesting transportation, a student must be registered with the Central Registration Office. All Uniondale registration requirements apply, except for proof of immunization. Requests for transportation should be addressed to the District Transportation office,Uniondale High School. This is necessary to enable the District to estimate its transportation needs for the following year.

C. PHYSICALLY HANDICAPPED

Transportation is available for handicapped children attending school. Parents are requested to submit a letter to the school nurse from the family health provider. This letter must clearly state the need, and duration of time the child will require transportation. Any parent requesting transportation for a child with asthma must also include an Asthma Action Plan completed by the health care provider. This information is submitted to the district health supervisor for approval or rejection before permission is granted.

Uniondale Schools Procedure for Registration of New Students

REGISTRATION INSTRUCTIONS

The following Original Documents must be presented to complete the registration process:

- Parent/ Guardian must produce an UNEXPIRED VALID Government issued Photo ID.
- You must submit the original birth certificate or record of baptism for each child.

If this is not available a passport may be used to determine a child's age. Last if you have none of the above you may supply the following for the child:

- 1. Official driver licensed or learner's permit
- 2. State or other government issued identification;
- 3. School photo identification with date of birth;
- 4. Consulate identification card;
- 5. Hospital or health records;
- 6. Military dependent identification card;

7. Documents issued by federal, state or local agencies (e.g., local social service agency , federal-Office of Refugee Resettlement).

8. Court orders or other court-issued documents (including, but not limited to judicial custody papers or guardianship papers)

9. Native American tribal document.

10. Records from nonprofit international aid agencies and voluntary agencies

• Evidence of Custody of the Child/Children, including, but not limited to Judicial Custody Orders or Guardianship papers. **Although the District requires the receipt both Custodial and parental Affidavits, there will exist certain circumstances upon which the District will only receive one Affidavit.

• You must submit a completed and notarized Form "A" for each child.

 \bullet IF YOU OWN A HOME, you must submit Form B (landlord affidavit) & your deed or current mortgage statement with 1 utility bill no older than 30 days.

• IF YOU ARE RENTOR/NON-OWNER, you must submit both Form B (Landlord Affidavit) and Form C (Tenant Affidavit), but in the event Form B is unavailable the Third Party Affidavit may be substituted. These documents must also be accompanied by 3 proofs identified in Section 1, below no older than 30 days with current address.

• McKinney-Vento Act Form completed for each child.

• You must submit a Health History Form, Health Records Requirements Form, Certificate of Immunization, Physical Examination Card for each child and it must be signed by a physician or health facility, for each child.

Child Development Pre-Kindergarten Program

The Family and Consumer Sciences Department is again offering to district youngsters, who are 3.5 years old after June 2, 2017, the opportunity to attend an Early Childhood Program at Uniondale High School. The purpose of the program is two-fold; first, to introduce youngsters to a pleasant pre-school experience, and secondly, to give the high school students registered in the Child Development classes a practical experience working with children.

The program runs for approximately **twelve** weeks in the spring, Monday through Thursday afternoon, dates posted in the calendar. There is a registration fee of \$75. Parents must provide transportation to and from the school. Class size for this program is very limited, with placement made upon return of registration forms. Initial registration is conducted by telephone, 516-918-1134. We request that you wait until the registration date posted in the calendar to call for further information, since Family and Consumer Sciences teachers receive the calls.

Before a child will be admitted to the Early Childhood Program, we must have proof of the following immunizations signed by your physician:

- 4 doses of Diphtheria and Tetanus toxoid-containing vaccine and Pertussis vaccine
- (DTaP/DTP/Tdap)
- Tetanus and Diphtheria toxoid-containing vaccine and Pertussis vaccine booster (Tdap)
- 3 doses of Polio vaccine (IPV/OPV)
- 1 dose of Measles, Mumps and Rubella vaccine (MMR)
- 3 doses of Hepatitis B vaccine
- 1 dose of Varicella (Chickenpox) vaccine
- 1 to 4 doses of Haemophilus influenzae type b conjugate vaccine (Hib)
- 1 to 4 doses of Pneumococcal Conjugate vaccine (PCV)

Homework Policy

Homework is considered an essential part of the student's educational program in the Uniondale Public Schools. Pupils must do homework regularly to succeed. The following are the main purposes of homework:

- 1. Provide essential practice in needed skills.
- 2. Help foster good work habits.
- 3. Afford opportunities for self-direction on the part of the student.
- 4. Extend and enrich school experiences for the pupil.
- 5. Acquaint the pupil with out-of-school learning resources.
- 6. Promote growth in self-responsibility on the part of the pupil.

The attitude of the parent toward the homework responsibilities of the child is most important. The parent who takes an active interest in the child's progress at school and at home and who has taught the child the value of education in our society will do more than anyone else in shaping the attitude of the student.

Parents should endeavor to provide a proper place for study and should see that the necessary materials are available. The student should be free from interruptions and conflicting demands during the time required to complete the assignments. Pupils should be encouraged to stick to the assignment, receiving advice and help only when necessary. The parent should never do the child's homework.

The parent is a partner with the student and a partner with the teacher in helping the student profit from well-planned homework assignments. If parents and teachers cooperate fully in the execution of homework policy, the results will be rewarding for all concerned.

Home Instruction

Home instruction is provided for children of the District who are unable to attend school. Children attending private and parochial schools are also eligible, providing they meet the conditions that warrants home instruction. The following conditions grant permission for home instruction.

1. The child is unable to attend school for at least eight consecutive weeks because of medical reasons or superintendent suspension

2. For medical reasons, a letter must be submitted to your child's school nurse from a physician stating the diagnosis and duration of the time the child will be unable to attend school.

This service is not available for kindergarten pupils. Home instruction will be provided as follows: Grades 1-6 One hour per day.

Grades 7-12 Two hours per subject each week.

If parents/guardians have any questions about home instruction they should contact the Home Instruction Coordinator at 918-1171.

Working Papers

Middle School Students who desire working papers must pick up the application from the GUIDANCE DEPARTMENT. Enter Information - Part 1, and signed by a parent. It would then be taken to the Health Office. A Birth Certificate or Passport is needed to Verify the student's age, and a physical which is less than a year old must be on file with the Health Office in order for the Nurse to issue the Physical Fitness Certificate. When this is completed a Student Employment Certificate (Working Card) will be issued by the HEALTH OFFICE.

High School Students who desire working papers must pick up the application from the HEALTH OFFICE. Enter Information - Part 1, and signed by a parent. It would then be taken back to the HEALTH OFFICE. A physical which is less than a year old must be on file with the Health Office in order for the Nurse to issue the Physical Fitness Certificate. You would then pick up the completed paperwork from the Health Office and bring it to the High School GUIDANCE DEPARTMENT along with a Birth Certificate or Passport to Verify the student's age. When this is completed a Student Employment Certificate (Working Card) will be issued by the GUIDANCE DEPARTMENT.

Report Cards

All the schools in the District issue report cards four times a year on the secondary level and three times a year on the elementary level. They are designed to interpret the student's progress in academic fields as well as his/her development as a person and a citizen.

Parents are urged to discuss the marks with the student and, in cases where the student has done poorly, try to determine the reason and plan a program for improvement. The parent should contact the teacher requesting an appointment to discuss the situation. Parents of students in the secondary schools who are doing poor work in more than one area should contact all the teachers concerned and the guidance counselor.

The telephone numbers are listed with the individual schools in this publication.

Health Services

All pupils of the Uniondale school district are provided health services according to state requirements, in addition to services approved by the Board of Education.

The school health office in each school is staffed by a registered professional nurse. The nurse maintains your child's health record, will provide first aid and assist students and parents with health problems throughout their years in Uniondale school district.

All students entering the Uniondale school district, on any grade level, must have a satisfactory physical assessment performed by a licensed health care provider in the state of New York. A dental certificate is requested for all new entrants. The physical assessment and dental certificates are acceptable if performed within one year of entry to our district.

All current students in grades Pre-Kindergarten, Kindergarten, 2nd, 4th, 5th, 7th, and 10th are required to have a physical examination yearly, preferably by their licensed health care provider. A report of these examinations given by a private health care provider is to be submitted to the health office in the pupil's school no later than October 15th. The school physician will perform a physical examination in school after this date if documentation is not received and approved.

Students wishing to participate in competitive sports must undergo a sports physical examination on a yearly basis. This examination is best performed by the students' private health care provider. The district physician will make the final determination if a student is physically fit to participate in competitive sports.

All students K through 12 receive vision, hearing, dental, height, weight, and blood pressure screenings. All new entrants receive eye muscle screening, distance/near vision and color blind screening. Pupils in grades 5 through 9 receive a scoliosis screening. These screenings are conducted by the school nurse at each school. Body Mass Index is required for pupils in grades Kindergarten, 2nd, 4th, 7th and 10th grades.

All students must meet the New York State Immunization requirements. Students will not be permitted to attend school according to State legislation until these requirements are satisfied. All new entrants to the district are required to provide proof of a tuberculin skin test (PPD) with results within the last year.

Students requiring medication during the school day, including nonprescription medication, must have signed parental permission to be administered, and a written order from a health practitioner, including name of medication, dosage and time of day to be given. ALL medications must be in the original pharmacy labeled containers. Otherwise, it cannot be accepted.

Students requiring use of crutches, cane, or any type of assisted device, during the school day, must have a note signed by their health care provider on file in the health office indicating limitations and clearance to attend school. The crutches, cane, or any type of assisted device must be provided by the parent or guardian.

Cafeteria Service

In all schools in the District, Federal and State subsidies make it possible to offer the student a wellbalanced, nutritional meal at a minimal or no cost. In addition to the lunch published in the monthly menu, a variety of salad plate lunches will be served daily. A breakfast program is available in all of the schools. The District offers parents the ability to pre-pay for meals online through the Internet.

Special Services for Students with Disabilities

In accordance with the Regulations of the Commissioner of Education, the Uniondale School District has the goal of providing all students with disabilities a free and appropriate public education (FAPE).

THe Uniondale School District engages in a continuous process of public awareness activities, screening and evaluation to locate, identify and refer young children who may have a disability as early as possible

The Uniondale School District provides a wide range of special education programs and services designed to help each student realize his/her educational potential. We offer a continuum of special education services, providing students with disabilities the least restrictive environment. Special Education services range from related services specified in a student's Individual Educational Plan to placement in an appropriate program. A primary focus is to ensure students with disabilities meet local and Regents requirements for a high school diploma or a Skills and Achievement commencement Credential (SACC). Students who have received a SACC or Career Development and Occupational Studies (CDOS) Commencement Credential may continue to attend secondary school level classes until they are 21 years of age.

Parent's licensed physicians, judicial officers and public agencies may seek the assistance of the district's professional staff and the Committee on Special Education by writing to Carol DelValle, Administrative Assistant for Special Services/Committee on Special Education at Cornelius Court School, 1060 Cornelius Court, Uniondale, NY 11553-1426 or by calling 560-8861. Teachers and other professional staff who suspect that a student may be eligible for special education services should follow district procedures governing the referral of students to the Committee on Special education.

Psychological Services

The school psychologist is trained in the identification and assessment of students' intellectual and emotional needs that influence the learning process. Additionally, the school psychologist can assist with improving the learning environment for students, teachers, administrators and parents by providing Individual Education Program (IEP)counseling support or developing Behavior Intervention Plans (BIP). The school psychologist can be a valuable resource person to contact if your child is experiencing emotional or interpersonal difficulties that warrant professional attention. Appointments with the school psychologist can be arranged by calling the school office or calling the Committee on Special Education office at 516-560-8861.

Speech and Language Therapy

The speech and language teacher assists with the identification and assessment of students with speech and language delays or disorders that prevent him/her from realizing their educational potential. Children designated for speech therapy by the Committee on Special Education receive services to develop age appropriate receptive and expressive language skills. If you suspect your child has a speech or language disability, please do not hesitate to contact the Committee on Special Education office at 560-8861/8969.

Academic Intervention Services (AIS)

New York State has set higher learning standards for all students in reading/language arts and mathematics. State tests in grades 3-8 require students to demonstrate their ability to read, write and listen in ELA and apply reasoning and computation skills in mathematics.

Students whose performance indicates they are at risk for not mastering the skills necessary to meet the state's learning standards are provided with additional instruction by a reading or math specialist in the elementary and secondary schools. Placement in AIS support classes is determined by the student's performance on state and district-mandated assessments.

Parents who have any questions or concerns about this program may contact the Director of English Language Arts or the Director of Mathematics.

English as a Second Language and Bilingual Instruction

These are state-mandated programs for students who are English Language Learners due to their limited proficiency in English. Students who come from homes in which a language other than English is spoken and fall below the statewide criterion level must receive English as a New Language (ENL) classes and, if Spanish-speaking, they may also be eligible to receive Bilingual Education. These programs are designed to help the pupil to adjust to the American school experience, to develop a sense of social comfort and to acquire the linguistic and scholastic skills necessary for full integration into general education classes. Pupils requiring ENL or Bilingual Education are routinely identified upon entrance into the schools. Parents who suspect that their children require ENL or Bilingual Education should contact the school principal, the student's guidance counselor or the Director of the Department of World Languages and Cultures.

Developmental Skills Program - Grades K-2

In order to ensure that all pupils in the primary grades are provided with a solid foundation in reading and writing, pupils in grades K-2 who are having difficulty in mastering the foundational skills needed for academic success receive additional instruction. Placement in the academic support program is determined by student performance on district-mandated assessments, teacher recommendations and overall classroom success.

Parents who have any questions or concerns about this program may contact the Director of English Language Arts or the Principal.

Social Workers

School social workers are involved with the community, school, staff and families to assist students with developing to their fullest potential. Within the school, the social workers are involved with programs that focus on enhancing self-esteem, social skills, conflict mediation and academic achievement. They are available to meet with students and families to review and address various concerns and to make referrals to social agencies that may be of assistance at a critical time. To schedule an appointment with the building social worker, please call the school office or the Committee on Special Education.

Guidance Program

The Uniondale School District strives to provide a comprehensive guidance program that focuses on the whole child. We aspire to cultivate atmospheres that are conducive to academic, social, emotional and physical growth. The District provides a vast array of course offerings to meet the needs of our diverse school population. It is imperative that both parents and students have a clear understanding of these offerings to make informed decisions when selecting courses as it pertains to meeting promotional standards, while simultaneously engaging and challenging our students. secondary course selections and achievement have a significant impact on determining a student's plans for the future. Both middle and high school students are assigned to a a school counselor. Counselors are assigned by grade in our middle schools. UHS counselors serve students in grades 9 -12 alphabetically. School counselors work with parents, students, staff, administration, and the community to maximize student achievement . Guidance seeks to identify and determine student abilities and interests in order for students to receive rigorous programs which enable them to attain their post secondary goals to become productive members of the larger and more complex society. Any parent/guardian who has any questions or concerns and/or would like to find out more about the department is welcome to contact the Guidance Office of their respective schools(s) to schedule an appointment

Scholarships

The Uniondale High School Guidance Department publishes a bi-weekly newsletter entitled "Knights News" highlighting scholarships, internships, camps, employment opportunities and other pertinent information. The newsletter is emailed directly to all students using their echalk email accounts. In addition it is posted on the UHS website and hard copies can be obtained in both the Guidance Office and the College and Career Room. Every year in the Spring the annual UHS "Scholarship Packet" is distributed to all seniors including a list of local awards and scholarships. The awards are presented by a myriad of public and private organizations including the Parent Teacher Association and various school personnel. The Award Ceremony is held in June.

*ALL SENIORS ARE STRONLY ENCOURAGED TO REVIEW ALL SCHOLARSHIP REQUIREMENTS AND APPLY IF APPLICABLE.

In addition, students may compete on a national basis for scholarships by taking the National Merit Scholarship Test (PSAT/NMAQT) in their junior year. The test will be given on Wednesday, October 19, 2016 at Uniondale High School for some 10th grade students and all 11th grade students.

This differentiated curriculum is designed to foster independent thinking, critical thinking, creative thinking, and problem solving. Children are always encouraged to take risk by attempting to solve complex problems in unique and original ways. The activities in the MAL Program are not only designed to complement and/or be an extension of the classroom. They are chosen and designed for their purposeful ability to meet the needs of academically talented students.

The program of instruction maximizes the opportunities for children to be producers rather than consumers of knowledge. It equips them with the ability to generate not only ideas but also the criteria with which to evaluate them. The children work in group activities as well as individually. Thus effective communication and decision making skills are fostered through group interaction, oral presentations, and written work.

The curricular emphasis for this year will be on further developing higher-level thinking skills, integrated projects/activities and problem-based learning. Students will be encouraged to work in teams whenever possible to strengthen their cooperative skills and give them the opportunity to work with others who "think like they do".

- 13. Students in the LAST swim class must be picked up promptly.

Behavior and Discipline Policy

The following infractions seriously violate the law or the well being of others and can result in a formal suspension from a program.

1. Physical assault, gross disrespect, verbal threats, or profanity directed toward a staff member.

2. Physical assault upon another student.

Senior Citizens' Tax Exemptions

Veterans Real Property Tax Exemption

Please call 571-1500, the Department of Assessment to see if you qualify for this new Veterans' Exemption. Gold Star Parents may also be eligible.

A senior citizen is entitled to a partial exemption from school district taxes when the following conditions exist:

- Must be 65 by December 31st (in husband and wife situation, only one party need be 65 as long as both names are on the deed).
- Own home for at least one year.
- Income limitation of \$37,399 (combined income of all owners) which includes Social Security and all other sources of income.
- The property must be owner occupied and be the primary residence.

NOTE: A child residing on the property who attends a public elementary or secondary school disqualifies the exemption.

Application must be made annually, on or before December 31st. The tax relief will then be applied to the next tax year.

Persons with disabilities and limited income may be eligible under the same guidelines as Senior Citizens.

NOTE: Residential real property may qualify for a partial exemption from school taxes under the New York State Tax Relief (STAR program). To receive such exemption, owners of qualifying property must file an application with their local assessor on or before December 31st.

Board of Education District Technology Systems - Acceptable Use and Internet Safety Policy

A. Purpose

- 1. The Uniondale School District is providing employees and students with access to the District's electronic communication system, which includes internet access.
- 2. The purpose of the District system is to assist in preparing students for success in life and work by providing them with electronic access to a wide range of information and the ability to communicate with people throughout the world.
- 3. Users may not use the District system for commercial purposes, defined as offering or providing goods or services or purchasing goods or services for personal use.
- 4. Users may not use the system for political lobbying, as defined by the State of New York.
- 5. The term "educational purpose" includes use of the system for classroom activities, professional or career development, and limited high-quality self-discovery activities.

B. Access to the System

- 1. The District Acceptable Use and Internet Safety Policy will govern all use of the District system. Student use of the system will also be governed by the disciplinary code. Employee use will also be governed by District policy.
- 2. The District Acceptable Use and Internet Safety Policy contains restrictions on accessing inappropriate material. However, the wide range of material available on the Internet reflects many points of view over which the district maintains no control and to which it does not necessarily subscribe.

C. Internet Safety

It is the policy of the Uniondale School District to protect students from inappropriate material on the Internet, as well to ensure the safety and security of students when using electronic communications such as electronic mail. This is done both through proper adult supervision of all students and adults using the Internet and by electronic means such as content filtering. To this end, although unable to guarantee that any selected filtering and blocking technology will work perfectly, the Board directs the Superintendent of Schools to procure and implement the use of technology protection measures that block or filter Internet access through the School District's internet service provider and which will restrict minors' access to visual depictions that are obscene, contain child pornography, or materials harmful to minors. This filtering also will restrict adults' access to visual depictions that are obscene or contain child pornography.

Such filtering may only be removed for teachers or other adults for bona fide research or other lawful purpose with permission from the Director of Technology and/or Director of Library Media Services and Integration or his or her designee. Any use of instant messaging and chat rooms is prohibited except for educational purposes. Violations may result in cancellation privileges and disciplinary and possible legal consequences.

The Superintendent or his or her designee also shall develop and implement procedures that provide for the safety and security of minors using electronic mail, chat rooms, and other forms of direct electronic communications; monitoring the online activities of minors using district computers; and restricting minors' access to materials that are harmful to minors.

In addition, the Board prohibits the unauthorized disclosures, use and dissemination of personal information regarding minors or other users; unauthorized online access by minors, including hacking and other unlawful activities; and access by minors to inappropriate material on the Internet and World Wide Web. The Superintendent or his or her designee shall establish and implement procedures that enforce these restrictions.

The Director of Technology and/or Director of Library Media Services and Integration, as designated under the district's Computer Network or Acceptable Use Policy, shall monitor and examine all district computer network activities to ensure compliance with this policy and any accompanying regulations. He or she also shall be responsible for ensuring that staff and students receive training on their requirements.

All users of the district's computer network, including access to the Internet and World Wide Web, must understand that use is a privilege, not a right, and that any such use entails responsibility. They must comply with the requirements of this policy and any accompanying regulations in addition to generally accepted rules of network etiquette and the district's Acceptable Use Policy. Failure to comply may result in disciplinary action including, but not limited to, the revocation of computer access privileges. As part of this policy and the district's policy on acceptable use of district computers, the district shall also provide age-appropriate instruction to minors regarding appropriate online behavior, including:

- interacting with other individuals on social networking sites and in chat rooms, and
- cyberbullying awareness and response.

Instruction will be provided even if the district prohibits students from accessing social networking sites or chat rooms on district computers. The school district is not responsible for failures in the operation or technical functioning of the Internet or its filtering or blocking system, the computers, hardware, or software used to access the Internet.

D. District Limitation of Liability

The District makes no warranties of any kind, either express or implied, that the functions or the services provided by or through the District system will be error-free or without defect. The District will not be responsible for any damage users may suffer, including but not limited to, loss of data or interruptions or service. The District is not responsible for the accurary or quality of the information obtained through or stored on the system. The District will not be responsible for financial obligations arising through the unauthorized use of the system.

E. Due Process

- 1. The District will cooperate fully with local, state, or federal officials in any investigation concerning to or relating to any illegal activities conducted through the District system or through any District accounts.
- 2. In the event there is an allegation that a student has violated the District Acceptable Use Policy, the parent will be provided with an oral and/or written notice of the alleged violation and an opportunity to present an explanation. This is in accordance with the due process rights of students.
- 3. Employee violations of the District Acceptable Use Policy will be handled in accordance with due process rights, District policy, New York State Education Law and collective bargaining agreements.

F. Search and Seizure

System users shall be made aware that they have no expectation or right of privacy in the contents of their personal files on the District system since the system will be monitored by a system operator(s).

G. Copyright and Plagiarism

- 1. Teachers will instruct students to respect copyright laws and to request permission when appropriate.
- 2. Teachers will instruct students in appropriate research and citation practices.

H. District Acceptable Use and Internet Safety Policy

The following guidelines are to be applied when using the District system:

1. Threats to personal safety of students

- a. Users will not post personal contact information about themselves or other people (i.e. address, telephone, school address, work address, etc.).
- b. Users will not agree to meet with someone they have met online without their parent's or guardian's approval and participation.
- c. Users will promptly disclose to their teacher or other school employee any message they receive that is inappropriate or makes them feel uncomfortable

2. Illegal Activities

- a. Users will not commit vandalism or engage in hacking activities. Vandalism or hacking will result in cancellation of system use privileges as well as possible prosecution. Vandalism is defined as a malicious attempt to harm or destroy district equipment or materials, data or another use of the district's system or any of the agencies or other networks that are connected to the Internet. This includes, but is not limited to, the uploading or creating or computer viruses. Tampering with or misuse of the computer system, hacking, or taking any other action inconsistent with this protocol and regulation will be viewed as a security violation. Violators will be responsible for any financial damages caused by their actions.
- b. Users will not attempt to gain unauthorized access to the District system or to any other computer system beyond their authorized access.
- c. Users may not possess bootleg software. Bootleg software means any software, which has been downloaded or copied, or is otherwise in the user's possession, without the appropriate registration of the software, including the payment of any fees owed to the owner of the software.
- d. Users may not download or otherwise add software programs to the District system.
- e. Users shall not use the District system or Internet to access, transmit or retransmit material which promotes violence or advocates destruction of property, including information concerning the manufacture of destructive devices, such as explosives, fireworks, smoke bombs, incendiary devices or the like.
- f. Users shall not use the District system or Internet to access, transmit or retransmit material which advocates or promotes hatred against particular individuals or groups of individuals or advocates or promotes the superiority or inferiority of one racial, ethnic or religious group.
- g. Users will not use the District system to engage in any illegal act.

3. System Security

- a. Users may not utilize the network in such a way that it will disrupt the use of the network by others.
- b. Staff and students are responsible for the accounts for which they have been provided passwords. Passwords should not be shared.
- c. Any user identified as a security risk or having a history of problems with other computer systems may be denied access to the Internet and/or to the District's computer system.

- d. Users will immediately notify a teacher or administrator if they have identified a possible security problem. Users will not go looking for security problems, because this may be construed as an illegal attempt to gain access.
- e. Users will avoid the inadvertent spread of computer viruses by following the District virus protection procedures if they download files onto the Districts' computers and/or networks. No files or disks may be loaded onto the Districts' computers and/or networks without a virus check and permission of designated district personnel.

4. Inappropriate Language

- a. Restrictions against inappropriate language apply to all messages.
- b. Users will not use obscene, profane, lewd, vulgar, rude, inflammatory, threatening, or disrespectful language.
- c. Users will not post information that, if acted upon, could cause damage or a danger of disruption.
- d. Users will not engage in personal attacks, including prejudicial or discriminatory attacks.
- e. Users will not harass another person. If a user is told by a person to stop sending them messages, they must stop.
- f. Users will not knowingly or recklessly post false or defamatory information about a person or organization.

5. Respect for Privacy

- a. Users will not report a message that was sent to them privately without permission of the person who sent them the message.
- b. Users will not post private or identifying information about any minor, other person, or themselves.

6. Respecting Resource Limits

- a. Users will not download files larger than 20 megabytes without permission.
- b. Users will not post chain letters or engage in "spamming".
- c. Access to news groups, if granted, will be limited to acceptable discussions.

7. Inappropriate Access to Material

a. Users will not use the District system to access material that is considered profane or obscene (pornography), that advocates illegal acts, or that advocates violence or discrimination towards other people (hate literature). District employees may access the above material only in the context of legitimate research.

b. If a user inadvertently accesses such information, they should immediately disclose the inadvertent access to a school administrator or other appropriate school employee. This will protect users against an allegation that they have intentionally violated the Acceptable Use and Internet Safety Policy.

8. Privileges

a.The use of the Internet and the District system by students and staff is a privilege, not a right, and inappropriate use will result in a cancellation of those privileges and disciplinary and possible legal consequences.

I. Posting on the District System and on the Internet

- 1. The District's Internet Publishing Policy will inform all decisions regarding the posting of material to the District website.
- 2. The District reserves the right to post student work and information on the District system for the purposes of portfolio assessment, research, or other educationally relevant uses.

Policy #9645 - Disclosure of Wrongful or Unlawful Conduct

The Board of Education expects that its officers and employees of the district to fulfill the public's trust and conduct themselves in a lawful manner, consistent with all applicable statutes, rules and regulations and all policies of the district.

The Board of Education shall, at its annual reorganization meeting, designate a Compliance Officer to receive and investigate complaints from its public employees under Section 75-b of the Civil Service Law, commonly referred to as the "Whistle blower" statute. The district shall not dismiss or take any other adverse personnel action against an employee who, in good faith, discloses information concerning wrongful or unlawful conduct by school district officers or employees, including, but not limited to, information concerning conduct which (a) constitutes a violation of a law, rule or regulation, which violation creates and presents a substantial and specific danger to the public health or safety; or (b) information concerning conduct which the employee reasonable believes to be true and reasonably believes constitutes wrongful or unlawful conduct by a public employee. For purposes of this policy, the term "wrongful conduct" shall be defined to include:

- theft of district money, property, or resources;
- misuse of authority for personal gain or other non-district purpose;
- fraud;
- violations of applicable federal and state laws and regulations; and/or
- · serious violations of district policy, regulation, and/or procedure.

The Board shall not retaliate by dismissing or otherwise taking an adverse employment action against any individual who discloses information to a government body pursuant to this policy, provided that the employee has first made a good faith effort to give to the district's Compliance Officer, the information which he/she intends to disclose to a governmental body. If the alleged wrongdoer is the Compliance Officer, then the employee shall report such information directly to the Superintendent of Schools.

An officer or employee who has knowledge of wrongful or unlawful conduct shall report the same to the district's Compliance Officer, 1-800-557-0031, who shall take immediate steps to conduct an investigation into the alleged violation and to report his/her findings and conclusions directly to the Board.

Prior to making any disclosure, the officer or employee shall provide the Compliance Officer with a reasonable period of time to conduct an investigation and to take appropriate action, unless there is an imminent and serious danger to the public health and safety.

Any officer or employee who believes that he/she has been subjected to an adverse employment action based upon his or her disclosure of alleged or actual wrongful or unlawful conduct may contest such action by filing a written complaints of reprisal with the Board. The Board, or its designee, will review the complaint to determine whether:

- (a) the complainant made a disclosure of alleged wrongful conduct before an adverse employment action was taken;
- (b) the complainant gave prior notice before making disclosure;
- (c) complainant has in fact suffered an adverse employment action after having made the disclosure;
- (d) such disclosure constituted the primary or motivating factor for such adverse employment action.

The Board, or its designee, shall conduct a full and fair investigation of the complaint. If the Board has delegated the investigation to a designee, such designee shall make proposed findings of fact and a recommendation directly to the Board as to what relief, if any, he or she deems appropriate if he/she finds that complainant has been retaliated against for disclosing information pursuant to this policy.

All complaints filed pursuant to this policy will remain confidential to the extent possible and subject to applicable laws and relevant provisions of collective bargaining agreements.

Given the nature of the type of information shared pursuant to this policy and the serious ramifications that may result from a complaint, the district recognizes that false accusations of wrongful or unlawful conduct can have serious effects on innocent people. Any person making a false report shall be subject to appropriate disciplinary action.

This policy shall be published in the school calendar, be posted in employee lounges, and given to all employees annually.

Excerpts from the Uniondale School District "Code of Conduct"

Student Rights and Responsibilities

The Board of Education's goal is to provide an environment in which student's rights and freedoms are respected. The Board, therefore, assures district students that they shall have all the rights afforded them by federal and state constitutions, statutes, and regulations. The Board also recognizes all federal, state, and local laws in connection with these rights, and reminds students that certain responsibilities accompany these rights.

It shall be the right of each district student:

- 1. To have a safe, healthy, orderly and courteous school environment;
- 2. To take part in all district activities on an equal basis regardless of race, sex, religion, national origin, or disability;
- To attend school and participate in school programs (e.g., student government) unless suspended from instruction and participation for legally sufficient cause as determined in accordance with due process of law;
- To have school rules and conditions available for review and, whenever necessary, explanation by school
 personnel; whenever necessary, provide written explanation
- To be suspended from instruction only after his/her rights pursuant Education Law, Section 3214 have been observed;
- 6. In all disciplinary matters, to have the opportunity to present his/her version of the facts and circumstances leading to imposition of disciplinary sanctions to the professional staff member imposing such sanction; and
- 7. To address building administration, central administration and/or the Board of Education

It shall be the responsibility of each district student:

- 1. To be familiar with and abide by all district policies, rules and regulations pertaining to student conduct;
- 2. To work to the best of his/her ability in all academic and extracurricular pursuits and strive toward the highest level of achievement possible;
- 3. To conduct himself/herself, when participating in or attending school-sponsored extracurricular events, as a representative of the district and as such hold himself/herself to the highest standards of conduct, demeanor, and sportsmanship, and accept responsibility for his/her actions;

- 4. To seek help in solving problems that might lead to discipline procedures;
- 5. To be in regular attendance at school and in class;
- To contribute to the maintenance of an environment that is conducive to learning and to show due respect to other persons and to property;
- 7. To dress appropriately for school and school functions in accordance with standards promulgated by the Board and the Superintendent;
- 8. To make constructive contributions to the school and to report fairly the circumstances of school-related issues.

Essential Partners Parents

All Parents are expected to:

- 1. Recognize that the education of their child(ren) is a joint responsibility of the parents and the school community;
- 2. Send their children to school ready to participate and learn;
- 3. Ensure their children attend school regularly and on time;
- 4. Ensure absences are excused;
- 5. Insist their children be dressed and groomed in a manner consistent with the student dress code;
- 6. Help their children understand that in a democratic society, appropriate rules are required to maintain a safe, orderly environment;
- 7. Know school rules and help their children understand them;
- 8. Convey to their children a supportive attitude toward education and the district;
- 9. Build good relationships with teachers, other parents and their children's friends;
- 10. Help their children deal effectively with peer pressure;
- 11. Inform school officials of changes in the home situation that may affect student conduct or performance;
- 12. Provide a place for study and ensure homework assignments are completed and
- 13. Notify the school of any change of address or phone number.

Expectations for Students and Others on School Property and at School Functions

The Board of Education of the Uniondale School District is committed to maintaining schools which provide students and staff with productive, satisfying and wholesome learning environments. Essentially this means that relationships are such that students can learn and teachers can teach. It is an environment where students and all others are expected to conduct themselves in an appropriate and civil manner with proper regard for the rights and welfare or others and for the care of all school property.

Student Dress Code

The responsibility for student dress and general appearance rests with individual students and parents. However, the Board of Education requires students to attend school in appropriate dress that meets health and safety standards and does not interfere with the learning process. The Board also requires students to wear appropriate protective gear in certain classes. Hats, clothing, and attire which bear an expression or insignia which is obscene or libelous, which advocates racial or religious prejudice, or is disruptive, is forbidden. The Board, after consulting with the community, and in keeping with community standards, prohibits students from wearing hats in the building.

The Superintendent of Schools and other designated administrative personal shall have the authority to require a student to change his/her attire should it be deemed inappropriate according to the above guidelines.

Uniforms

The Board of Education encourages and supports the wearing of uniforms by students.

Prohibited Conduct

The following discipline code applies to the behavior of all district students while attending school, and/or on school grounds, in school buildings, and/or participating in school-sponsored activities. Serious or flagrant violations of the District's code of conduct can result in an immediate hearing with the Superintendent or Board of Education. Students may be subject to disciplinary action, up to and including suspension from school, if they engage in conduct that is disorderly insubordinate, disruptive, violent or endangers the safety, morals, health or welfare of others. Examples include but are not limited to:

- Fighting or engaging in violent behavior
- Threatening another with bodily harm
- Intimidating students or school personnel
- Making unreasonable noise that disrupts the instructional and learning environment
- Using abusive language or gestures, including racial, ethnic, or sexual remarks which are improper
- Obstructing vehicular or pedestrian traffic
- Creating a hazardous or physical offensive condition
- Failing to comply with the lawful directions of teachers, school administrators or other school employees in charge of the student
- Tardiness
- Missing or leaving school without permission

- Plagiarism
- · Vandalism or any destruction of real and/or personal property (including graffiti or arson)
- Libel and/or slander
- Theft or robbery
- Truancy
- Smoking
- Possession/use/sale/being under the influence of drugs or alcohol
- Possession or use of weapons or fireworks
- Possession or use of tobacco or tobacco products
- Lewd behavior
- Possession or use of obscene materials
- Stealing
- Gambling
- Throwing objects in classrooms, cafeterias, halls, etc.
- Hazing
- Trespassing
- Displays or threatens to use what appears to be a weapon or facsimile of a weapon
- Computer/electronic communication misuse

Uniondale School District Code of Conduct and policies comply with federal civil rights laws and regulations enforced by the United States Department of Education's Officer for Civil Rights (OCR), including Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, which prohibits discrimination on the basis of race, color, or national origin; Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972, which prohibits discrimination on the basis of sex; and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 and Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, both of which prohibit discrimination on the basis of disability.

The Dignity for All Students Act or Dignity Act ("DASA") of 2012 was established with the broad legislative intent to provide a school environment free of discrimination and harassment.

DASA states that NO student shall be subjected to harassment or discrimination by employees or students on school property or at a school function based on their actual or perceived race, color, weight, national origin, ethnic group, religion, religious practice, disability, sexual orientation, gender, or sex.

The Uniondale School District Code of Conduct in its entirety is available on the District's website and in the form of a brochure available in all District schools.

Policy - Student Uniforms

The Board of Education requires all students to attend school in appropriate attire. Unless a parent or person in parental relation has received the appropriate exemption as set forth below, a student in grades K-12 shall be required to wear a uniform during the school day. The Board of Education adopts this policy for the purposes of:

- 1. Prompting a more effective learning environment;
- 2. Improving student conduct and discipline;
- 3. Improving student academic performance;
- 4. Fostering student self-esteem;
- 5. Fostering school unity and pride.

Parents or persons in parental relation who do not wish their student to wear a uniform must secure an exemption from the uniform requirement. An exemption may be secured by:

- Filling out a form indicating the parent or person in parental relation desire to refrain from having their child wear a uniform. Said form must be signed by the student's parent or person in parental relation and returned to the building principal or designee.
- 2. Upon receipt of an application for an exemption, the building principal or designee shall schedule a conference with the parent or person in parental relation to discuss the basis for the request for an exemption. To secure such exemption, the parent or person in parental relation must agree that the child will wear appropriate dress consistent with the Student Dress Code. Specifically, the parent or person in parental relation must agree that the child will wear appropriate dress. The parent or person in parental relation must further agree that the child will not wear indicia of gang association, hats, clothing or attire which bears an expression or insignia which is obscene or libelous, which advocates racial or religious prejudice, or is disruptive.
- 3. A student may not be considered non-compliant with this policy (insubordinate) for failing to wear the uniform if his/her parent or person in parental relation has received an exemption from the policy.

Any student who has neglected or refused to comply with the uniform policy and whose parent or person in parental relation has not obtained an exemption shall be subject to the following forms of discipline:

- a. Student-Principal conference;
- b. Parent conference;
- c. Reprimand;
- d. An in-school suspension.

The following uniform will be required to be worn by all students in Grades K-12:

MALE: Navy blue pants

Light blue shirt (oxford 3-button pullover with collar, or a traditional buttondown shirt)

White, blue, or black socks

Black footwear (shoes, sneakers)

- OPTIONAL: Sweater navy blue (crew neck, v-neck, or cardigan) Tie navy blue School emblem on shirt or sweater Turtleneck - light blue
- FEMALE: Navy blue pants, or skirt (pleated or straight), or jumper Light blue shirt (oxford or traditional button-down shirt) White, blue, or black socks Black footwear (shoes, sneakers)

OPTIONAL: Sweater - navy blue (crew neck, v-neck, or cardigan) Tie - navy blue Tights - navy blue or black Turtleneck - light blue

ABSOLUTELY NO DENIM, DUNGAREES, OR JEANS! ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS - NO SWEAT PANTS - EXCEPT ON GYM DAY - MIDDLE SCHOOLS AND HIGH SCHOOL - NO SWEAT PANTS

FERPA Annual Notification

Notification to Parents and Students of Rights Concerning a Student's School Records

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) grants parents or guardians and students over eighteen (18) years of age ("eligible students") certain rights with respect to the student's education records. They are:

- 1. The right to inspect and copy the student's education records, within 45 days from the day the District receives a request for access.
 - Parents or guardians of students less than eighteen (18) years of age and students older than eighteen (18) years of age have the right to inspect and copy the student's permanent record. Parents, guardians or students should submit to the school principal (or appropriate school official) a written request that identifies the record(s) they wish to inspect. The principal will make arrangements for access and notify the parent(s)/guardian(s) or eligible student of the time and place where the records may be inspected.

The District charges a nominal fee for copying, but no one will be denied their right to copies of their records for inability to pay this cost.

The rights contained in this section are denied to any person against whom an order of protection has been entered concerning a student.

2. The right to request an amendment of the student's education records that the parent(s)/guardian(s) or eligible student believes are inaccurate, misleading, irrelevant, or improper.

Parents/guardians or eligible students may ask the District to amend a record that they believe is inaccurate, misleading, irrelevant, or improper. They should write the school principal or records custodian, clearly identifying the part of the record they want changed, and specify the reason.

If the District decides not to amend the record as requested by the parent(s)/guardian(s) or eligible student, the District will notify the parent(s)/guardian(s) or eligible student of the decision and advise him or her of their right to a hearing regarding the request for amendment. Additional information regarding the hearing procedures will be provided to the parent(s)/guardian(s) or eligible student when notified of the right to a hearing.

3. The right to permit disclosure of personally identifiable information contained in the student's education records, except to the extent that FERPA or state law authorizes disclosure without consent.

Disclosure is permitted without consent to school officials with legitimate educational or administrative interests. A school official is a person employed by the District as an administrator, supervisor, instructor, or support staff member (including health or medical staff and law enforcement unit personnel); a person serving on the Board; a person or company with whom the District has contracted to perform a special task (such as an attorney, auditor, medical consultant, or therapist); or a parent(s)/guardian(s) or student serving on an official committee, such as a disciplinary or grievance committee, or assisting another school official in performing his or her tasks.

A school official has a legitimate educational interest if the official needs to review an education record in order to fulfill his or her professional responsibility.

Upon request, the District also discloses education records without consent to officials of another school district in which a student has enrolled or intends to enroll, as well as to any person as specifically required by state or federal law.

Disclosure is also permitted without consent to: any person for research, statistical reporting, or planning, provided that no student or parent(s)/guardian(s) can be identified; any person named in a court order; and appropriate persons if the knowledge of such information is necessary to protect the health or safety of the student or other persons.

4. The right to prohibit the release of directory information concerning the parent's/guardian's child.

Throughout the school year, the District may release directory information regarding students, such as: name, address, telephone number, electronic mail address; photograph, date and place of birth, major course of study, participation in school activities or sports, weight and height if a member of an athletic team, dates of attendance, degrees and awards received, and most recent school attended.

Any parent(s) or guardian(s) or eligible student may prohibit the release of any or all of the above information by delivering a written objection to the building principal within ten (10) business days of the receipt of this notice.

5. The right to file a complaint with the U.S. Department of Education, concerning alleged failures by the District to comply with the requirements of FERPA.


