There are seven Texas Medicaid Waivers that support longterm and community-based services for people with disabilities or special health care needs in order to help them live in their community.

What?

Potential services include:

- Nursing care and personal care needs
- Home and vehicle modifications
- Supported employment
- Respite care
- Therapies

When?

Tips

Sign your child up for the Medicaid Waiver Interest Lists as soon as possible. The sooner your child is on the list the sooner services can potentially begin. It will be years, sometimes 15-20 years, before your child's name comes up for consideration.

Important Tips about the Medicaid Waiver Lists

- Request an email or letter confirming your child has been signed up and keep this information in a safe place.
- Call and update your contact information yearly.
- If your child is in crisis or has high medical needs you can reach out to your LIDDA to ask about diversion slots and if your child qualifies.

Texas **Medicaid Waivers**

Consider adding your child to as many of the lists as possible

Community Living Assistance and Support Services

Provides home and community-based supports to children and adults with related conditions. A related condition is something other than an intellectual disability or mental illness. The child or adult must have been identified before age 22. Over 200 related conditions qualify for CLASS. Some examples of a related condition are: Autism, Seizure Disorder, Cerebral Palsy, and Spina Bifida.

Deaf Blind with Multiple Disabilities

Provides services to children and adults who are deaf-blind or a related condition that leads to deaf-blindness. The child or adult must also have another disability to qualify.

Home and Community-based Services

Provides services to children and adults with an intellectual disability or a related condition. The child or adult must have been identified with a disability prior to age 22.

Medically Dependent Children Program

Provides services to children and adults who are 20 and younger and are medically fragile. The child or adult must be eligible for Medicaid and able to receive Supplemental Security Income.

STAR+PLUS Home and Community-based Services

Provides services to adults over the age of 21 to individuals who qualify for nursing facility care and desire to receive acute care and long-term services and supports in their community. The adult must be eligible for Medicaid and able to receive Supplemental Security Income.

Texas Home Living

Provides services to children and adults with an intellectual disability or related condition. The individual must have been identified with a disability prior to age 22.

Youth Empowerment Services

Provides home and community-based services to children under the age of 19 who otherwise would need psychiatric inpatient care or whose parents would turn to state custody for care.
