



- Participating in job fairs

- Ensure that individual counseling of applicants with the certification specialist and our district's personnel director takes place to assure ourselves that certification credentials are appropriate for teaching assignments and highly qualified requirements
- Informational presentations and literature will be made available to all instructional staff by the district's personnel director to ensure understanding of and compliance with qualification requirements
- Monitoring of subjects taught by each teacher in comparison to the certification of each teacher by principal and campus administrators
- Offering a year-long teacher-mentoring program to all teachers new to the field of teaching
- Making workshops available to new teachers to the field of teaching
- Having each Department Head meeting with new teachers regularly and providing any help needed
- New teachers must complete attain highly-qualified status within the required timeframe issued by their respective certification program.

#### The Purpose of the Migrant Program:

- (2) support high-quality and comprehensive educational program for migratory children to help reduce the educational disruptions and other problems that result from repeated moves;
- (3) ensure that migratory children who move among the States are not penalized in any manner by disparities among the States in curriculum, graduation requirements, and State academic content and student academic achievement standards;




