




School Support Updates Attendance & Chronic Absenteeism



Mindful De-Escalation PD, a multisession crisis prevention, intervention and response workshop with the frame of mindfulness and a focus on self-awareness.


Monthly trainings with the goal of training 2 members from the crisis teams from each school.


